

A National Survey Of Voter Attitudes On Immigration

Strategic Summary: The proposal

- Three quarters of American voters support a comprehensive, bipartisan immigration reform proposal that combines toughness, fairness, a guest worker program, family reunification, and a path to legal residency for undocumented immigrants who are already here.
- Support for this proposal is solid across party, regional and demographic lines.
- Voters support each component of the proposal as well as the overall package.
- Support for the proposal holds firm after voters hear positive and negative messages.

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Strategic Summary: Candidates

- Most voters do not base their support for political candidates on the immigration issue. However, even those that do are solidly in favor of this immigration reform proposal.
- Over two thirds of all voters say they would be more likely to vote for a candidate who supports this type of immigration proposal.

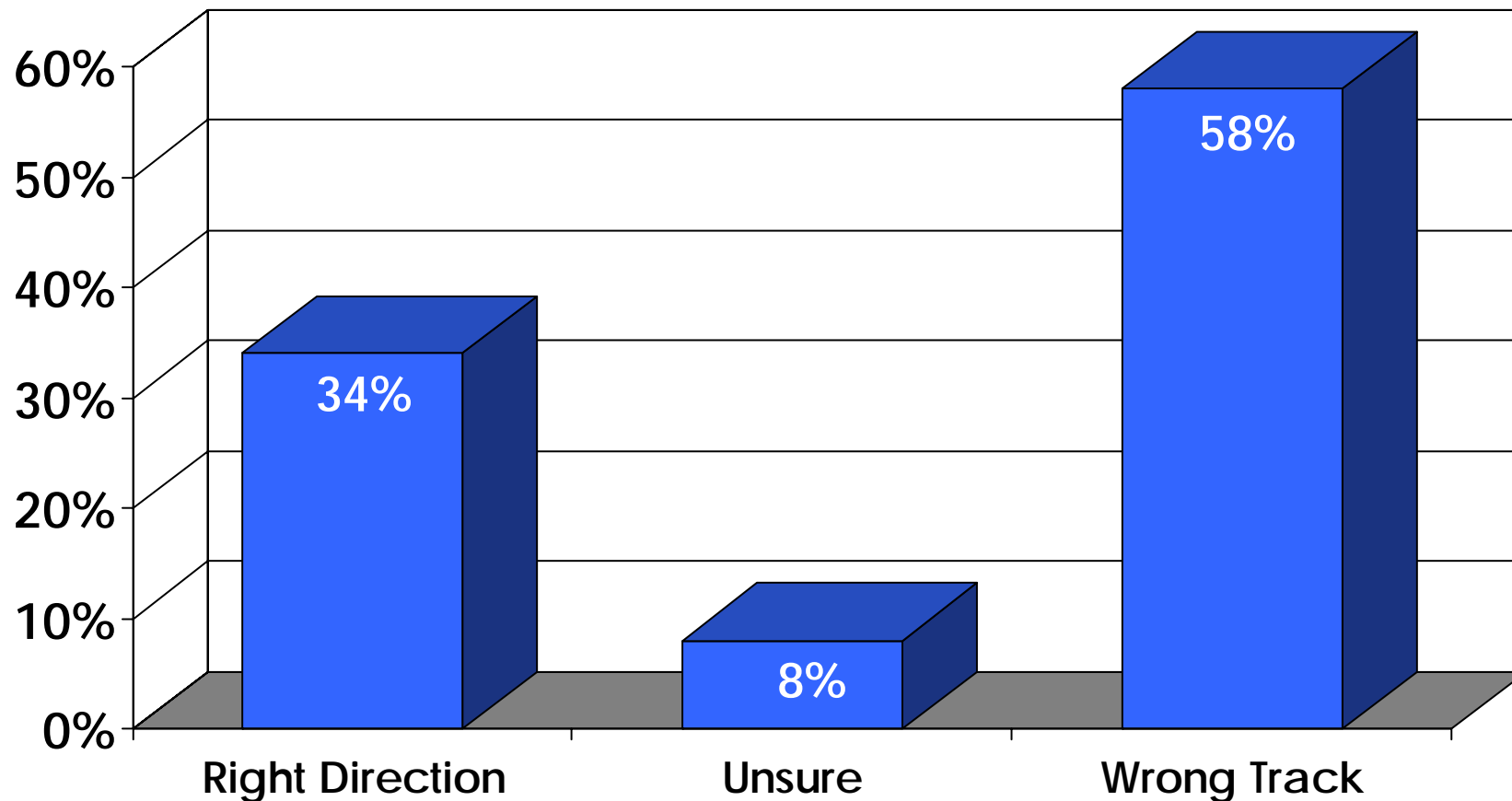
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Strategic Summary: Context

- Voters overwhelmingly believe the immigration system is broken and needs to be fixed. They want a controlled system that would replace an illegal immigration flow with a legal immigration flow.
- The vast majority of voters believe that deporting the 10 million undocumented immigrants currently in the United States is unrealistic.
- More than 8 in 10 believe that if an immigrant has been in this country working, paying taxes, and learning English, there should be a way for them to become a citizen.

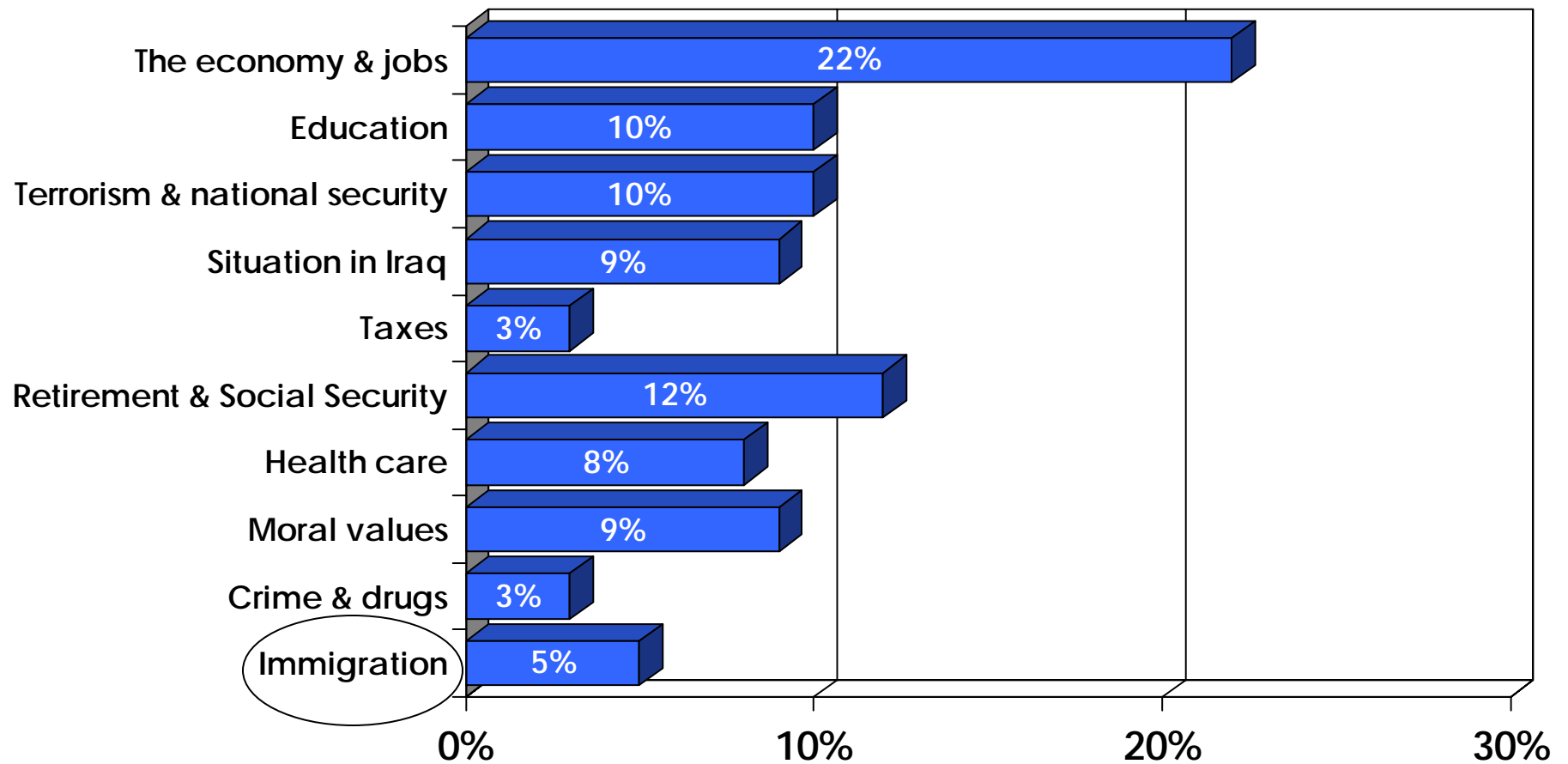
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Do you feel things in this country are going in the right direction, or have they gotten off on the wrong track?



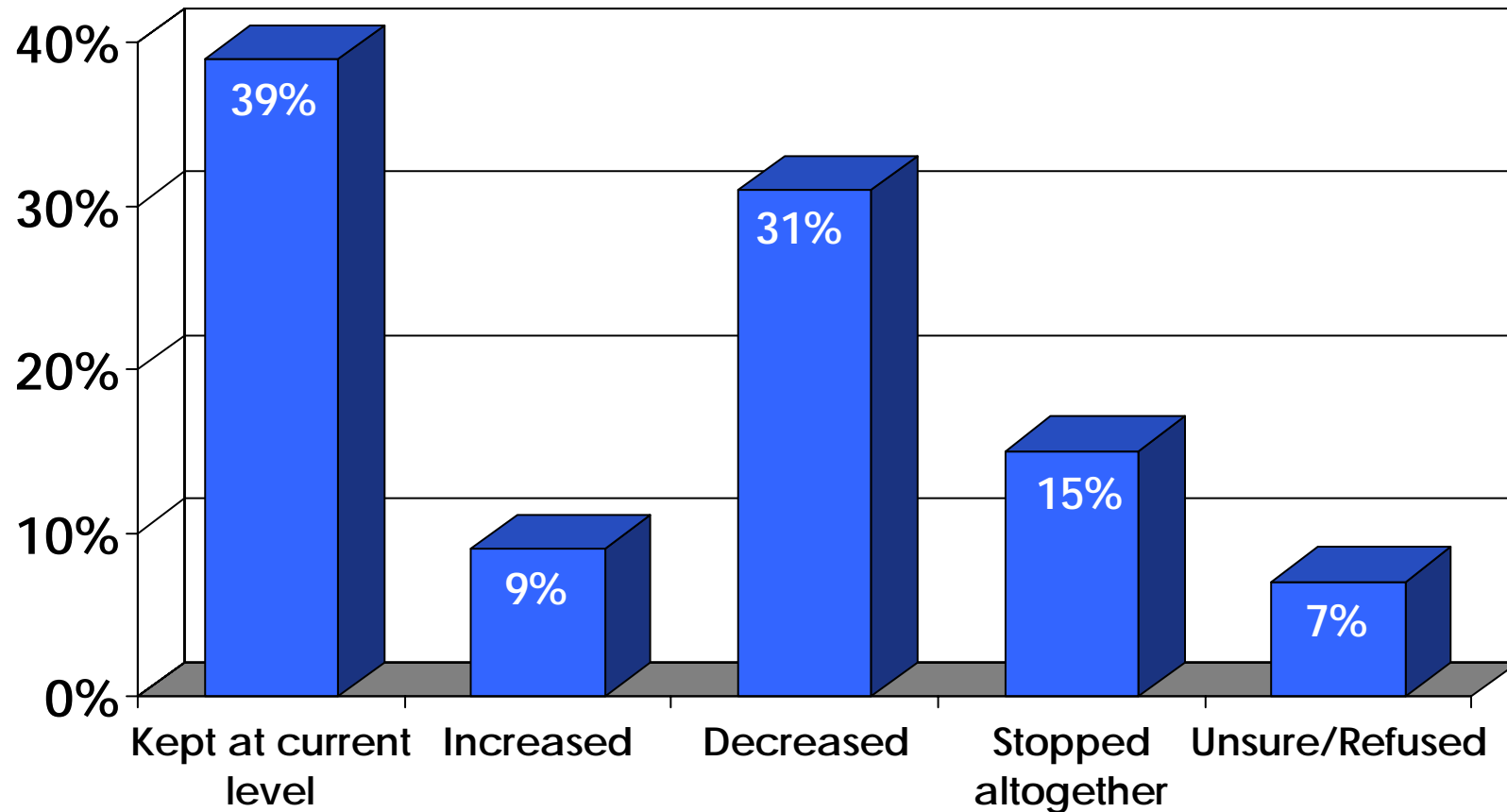
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Please tell me which one of these you personally worry about the MOST:



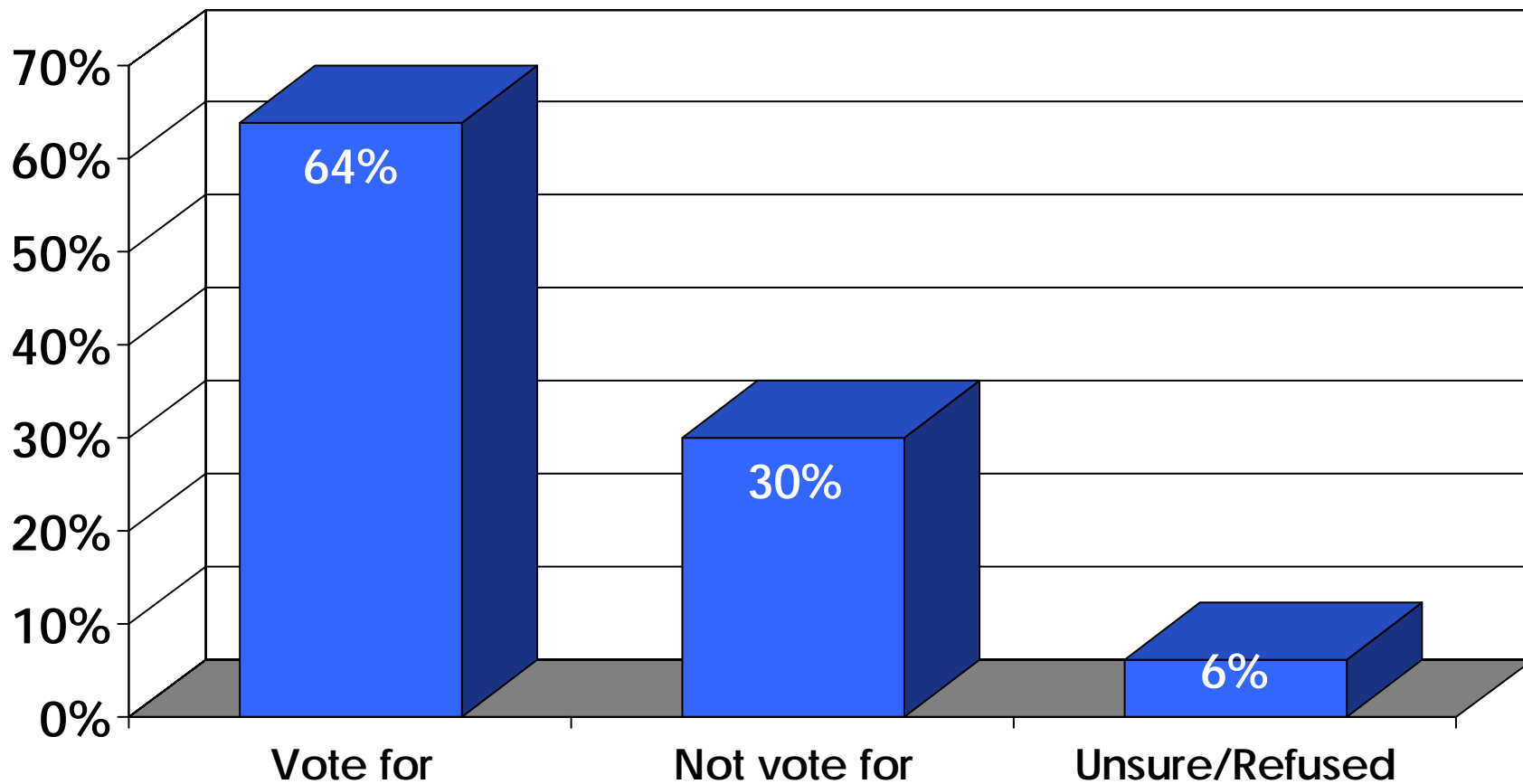
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Thinking about legal immigration, should the number of immigrants allowed into the US each year – be kept at its current level, increased, decreased, or stopped altogether?



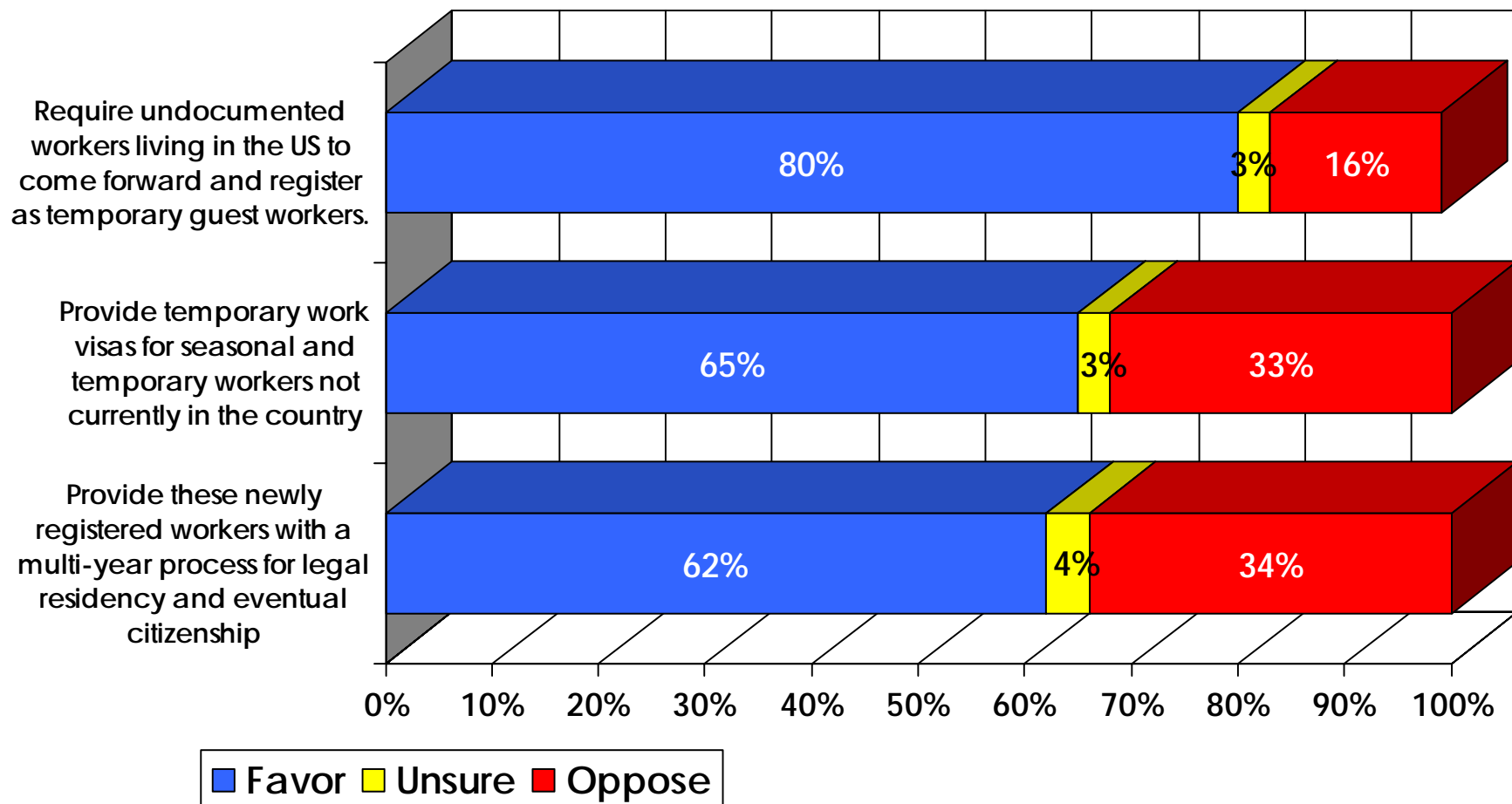

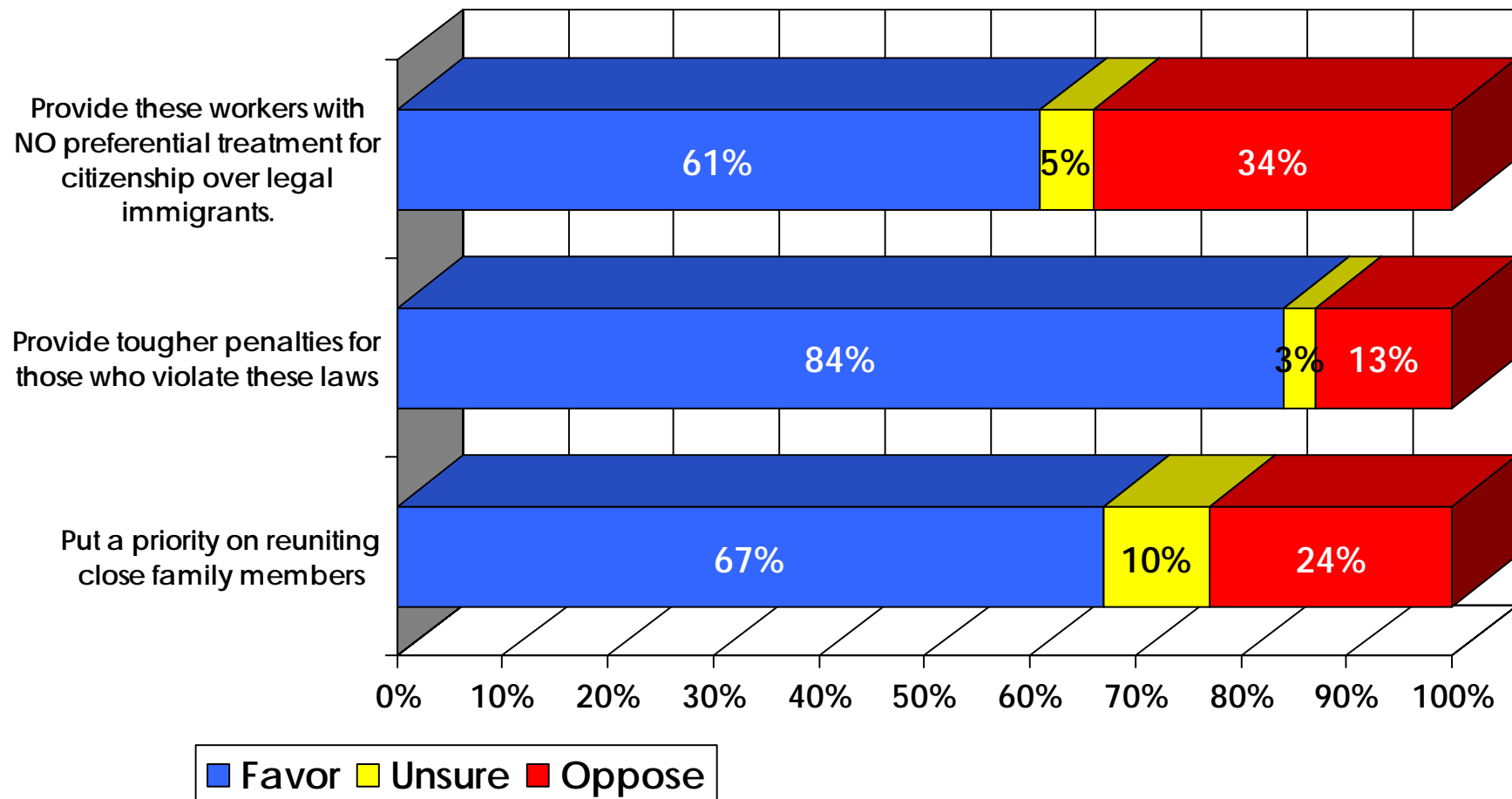
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Congress is considering a bipartisan immigration reform proposal that would do several things. I am going to read you several items. Please tell me if you would favor or oppose this part of the proposal.



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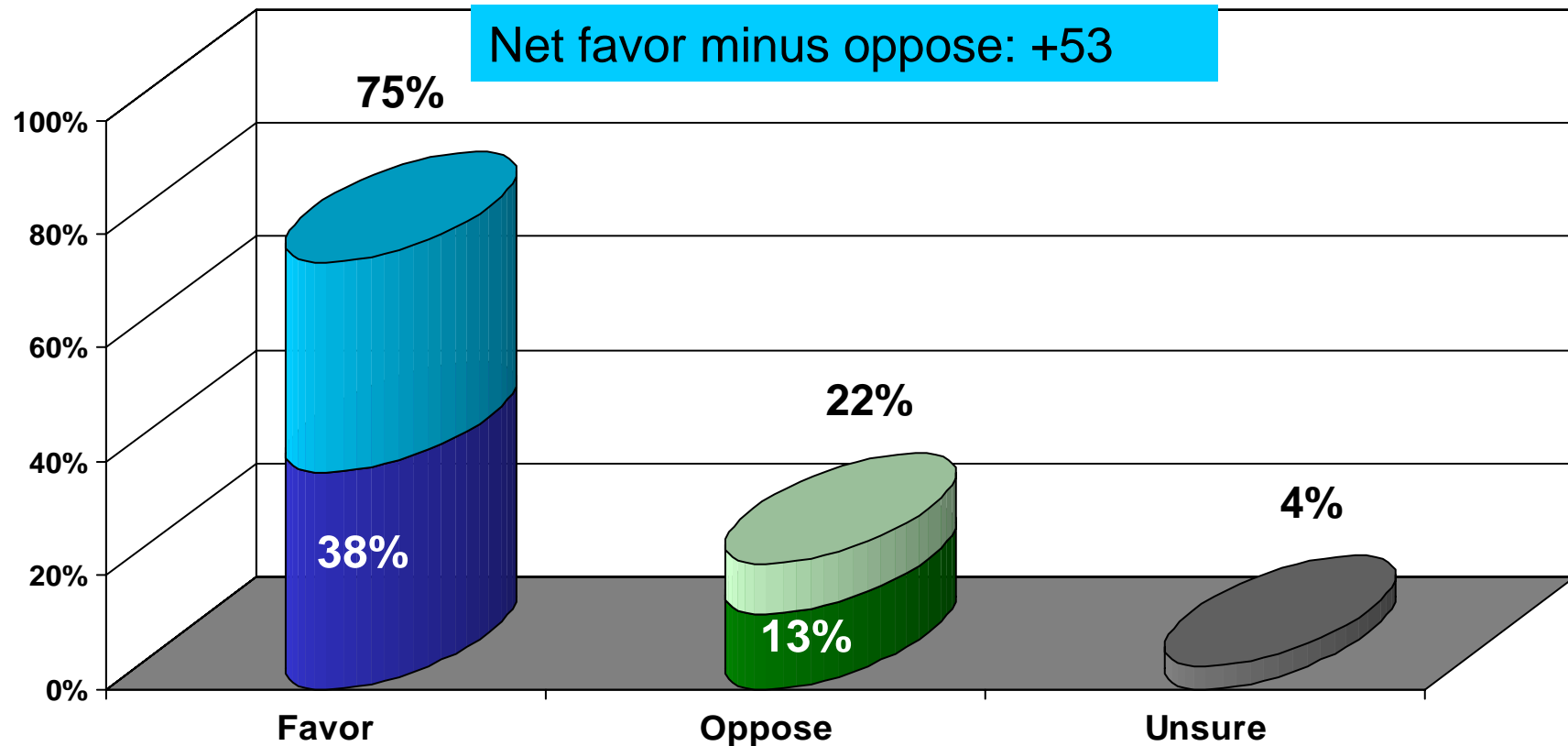
Description of proposal

Now, thinking about this entire bipartisan proposal, which would contain all of these items, including:

- *Require undocumented workers living in the US to come forward & register as temporary guest workers*
- *Provide temporary work visas for seasonal & temporary workers not currently in the country*
- *Provide these newly registered workers with a multi-year process for legal residency & eventual citizenship*
- *Provide these workers with NO preferential treatment for citizenship over legal immigrants*
- *Provide tougher penalties for workers or employers who violate these laws*
- *Put a priority on reuniting close family members*

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Three-quarters of voters support the proposal, 38% intensely.

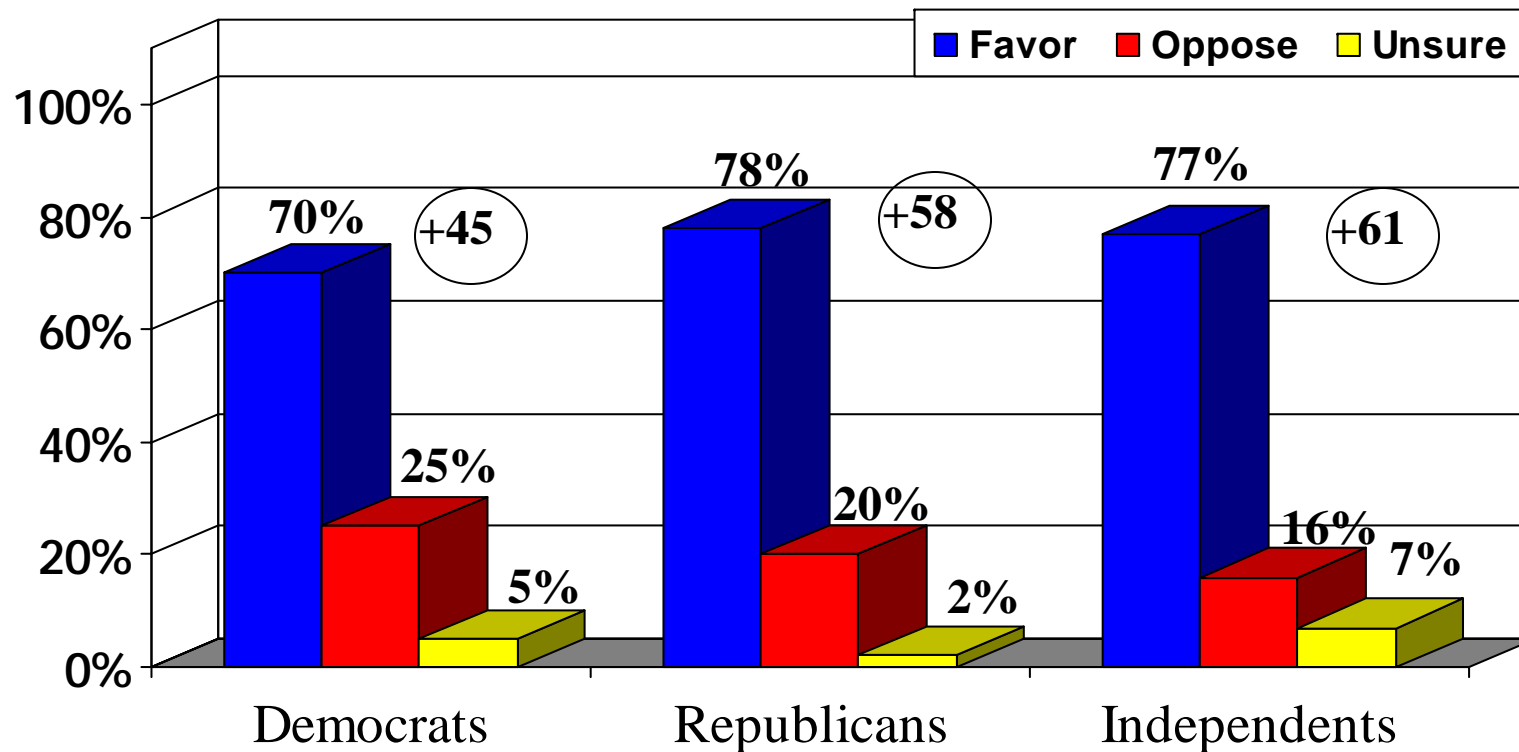


Based on this description, would you favor or oppose this proposal?

Darker colors signify intensity

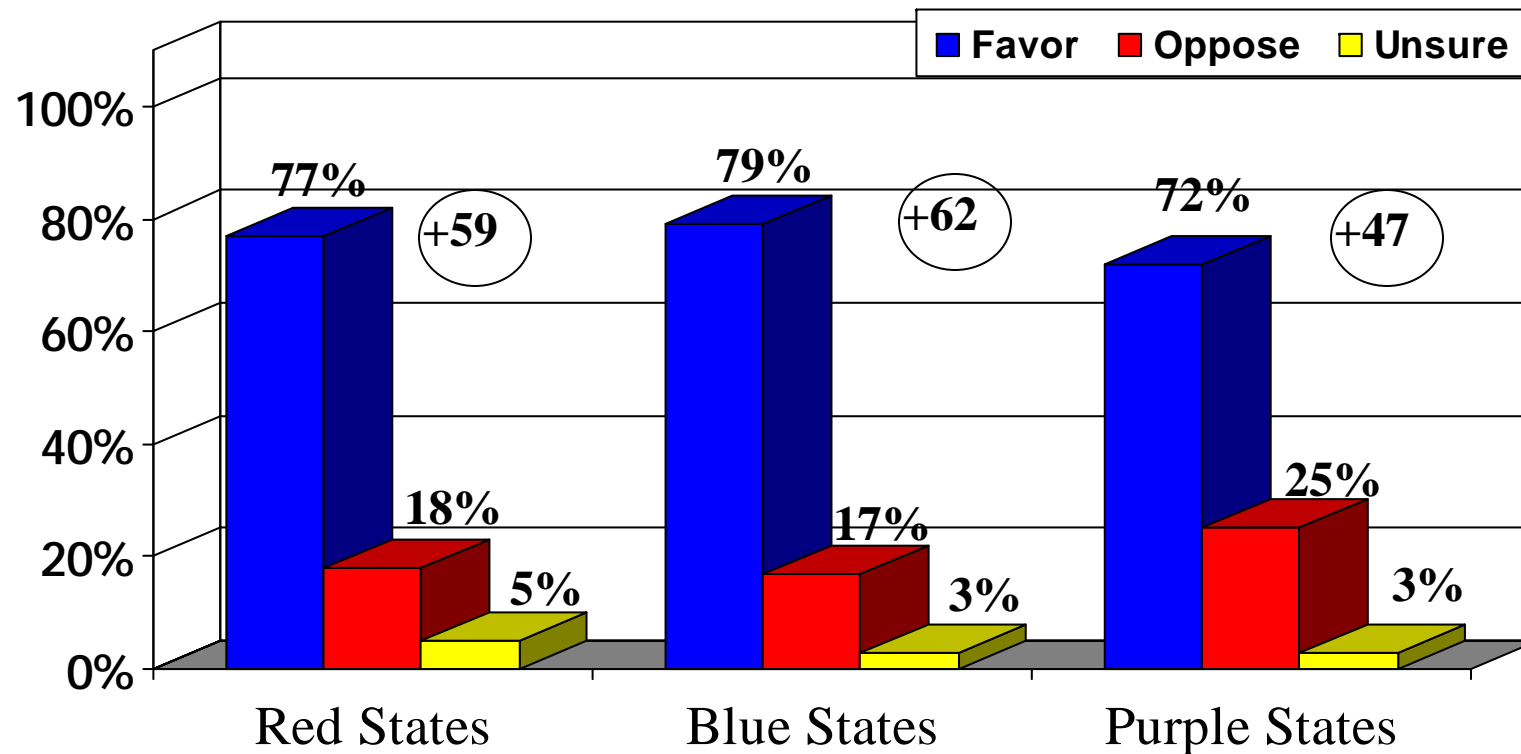
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Support for the proposal is strong across party lines.



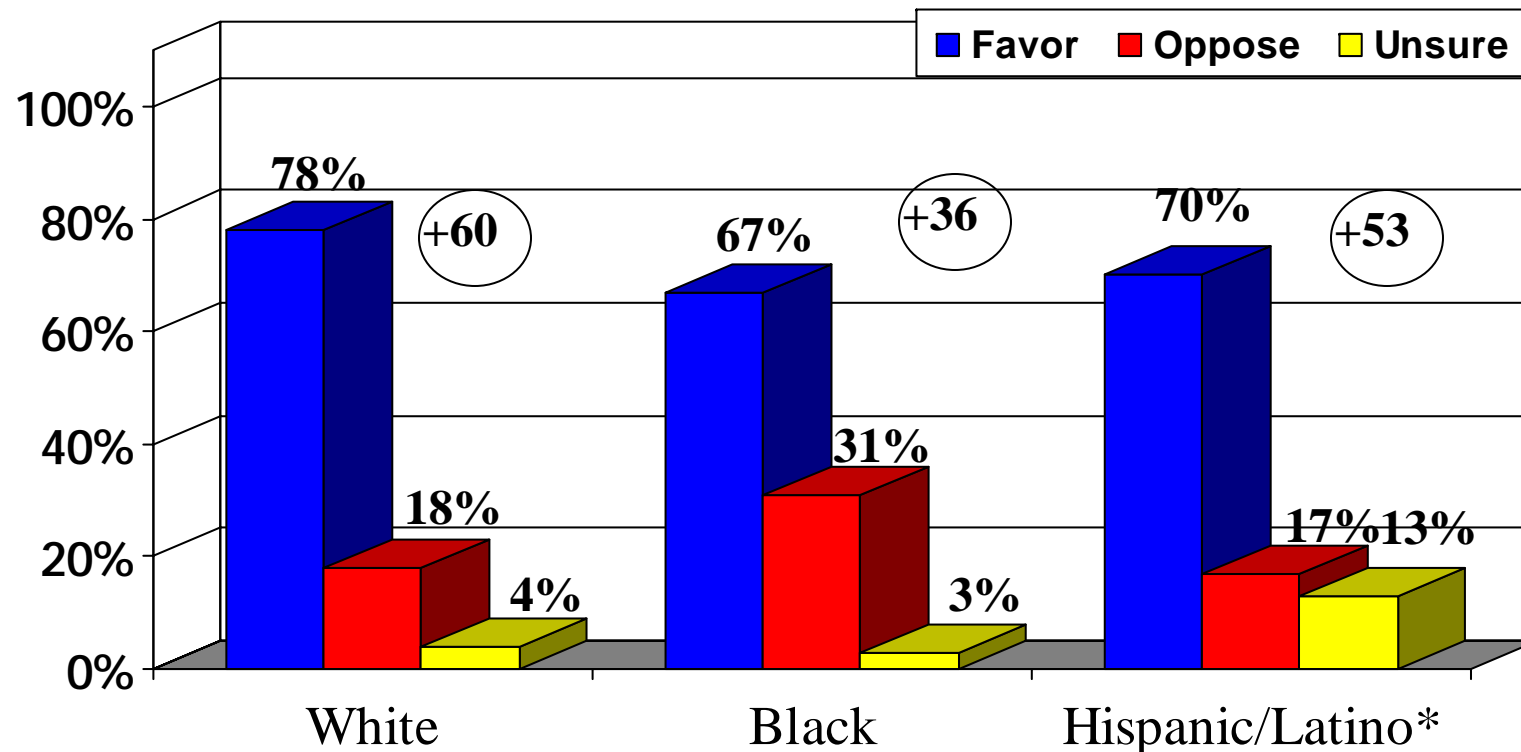
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Both red and blue states are firmly on board.



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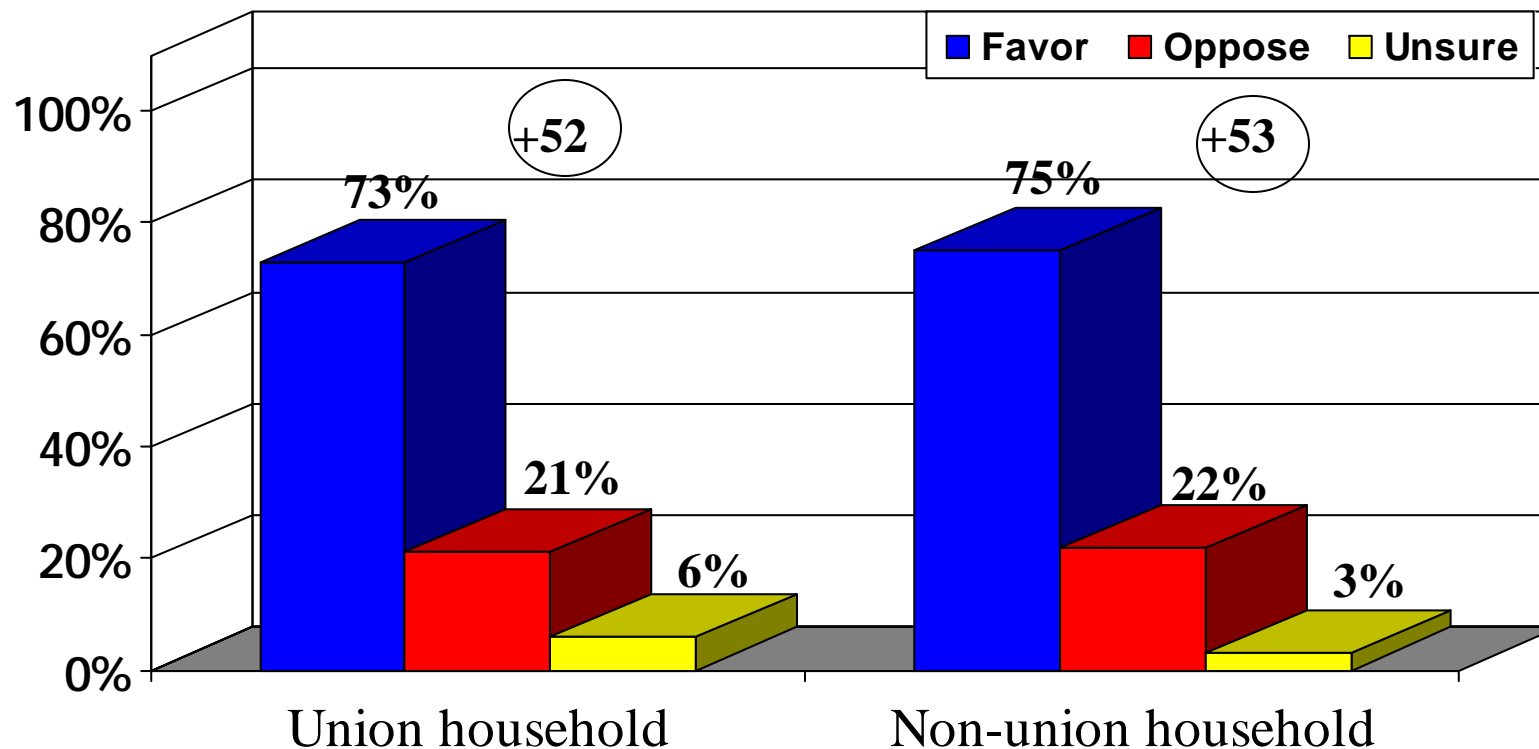
There is over two-thirds support for the proposal across racial groups.



*N = 265 registered likely Hispanic voters

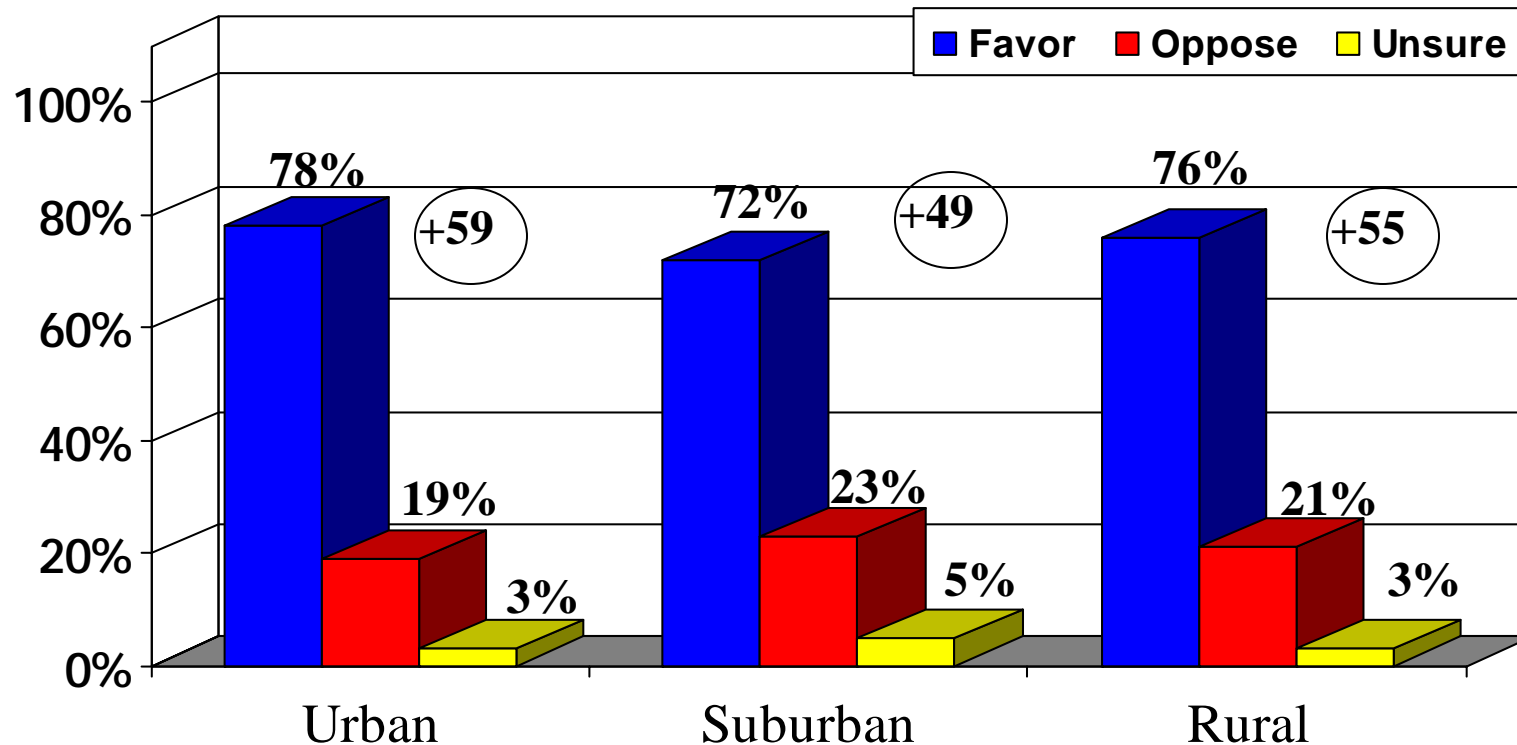
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Union and non-union households are similarly supportive.



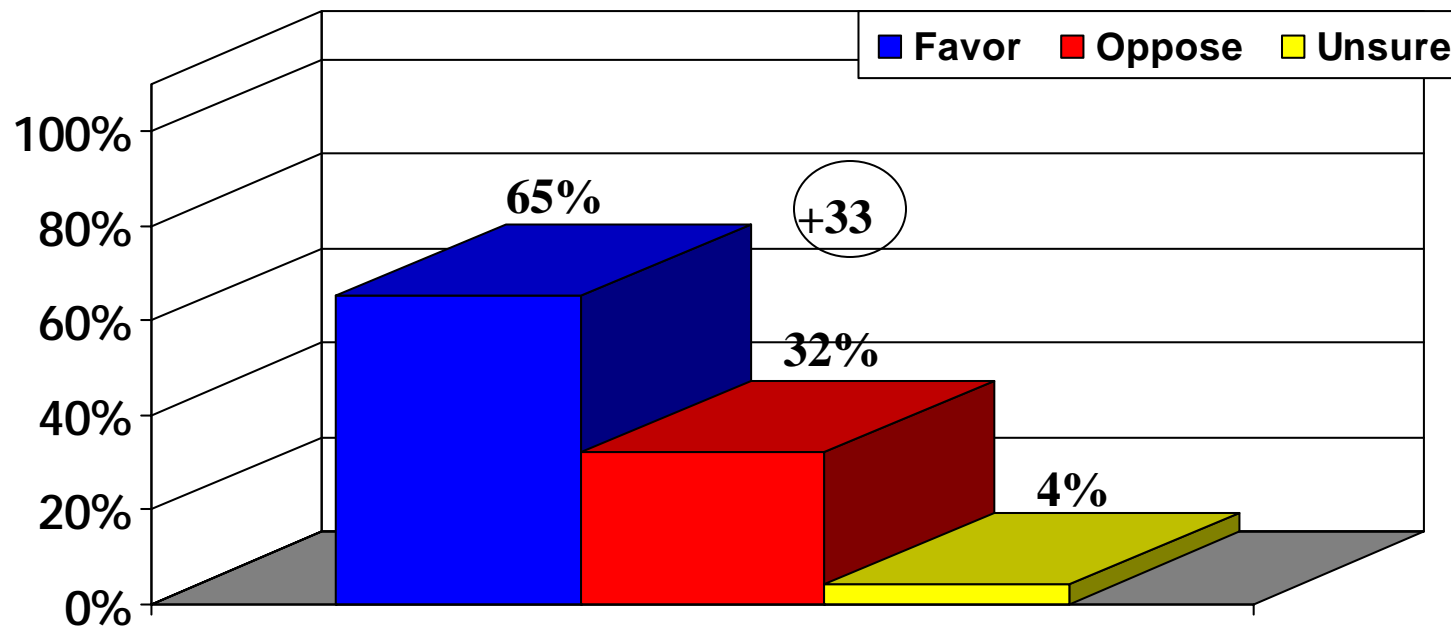
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Across urban, suburban and rural areas, more than seven in 10 voters are in favor of the proposal.



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Two-thirds of single-issue immigration voters support the proposal.

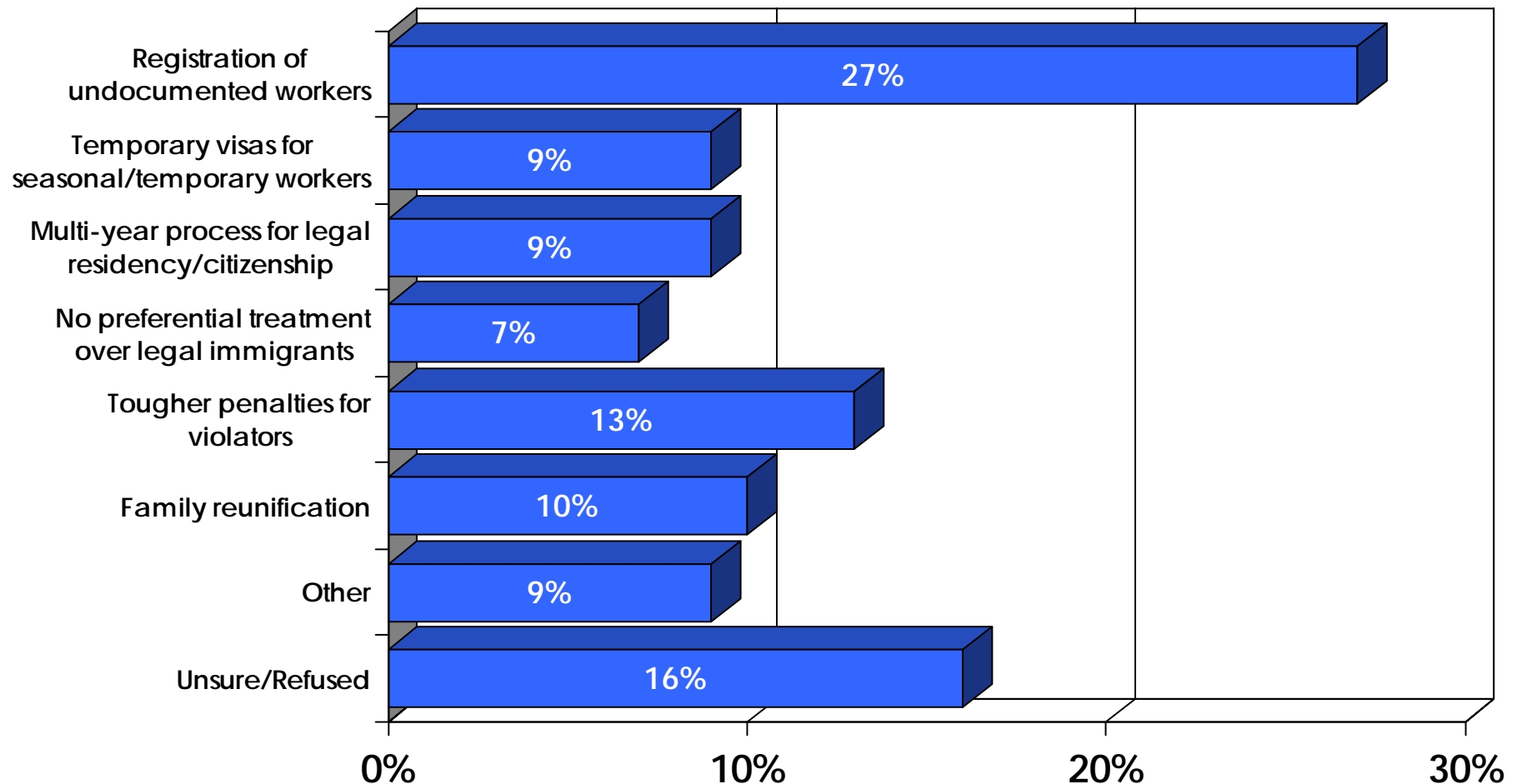


Voters who say they would NOT vote for a candidate they disagreed with on immigration

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And, which of the items in this proposal was most important to you in your decision to support this proposal?

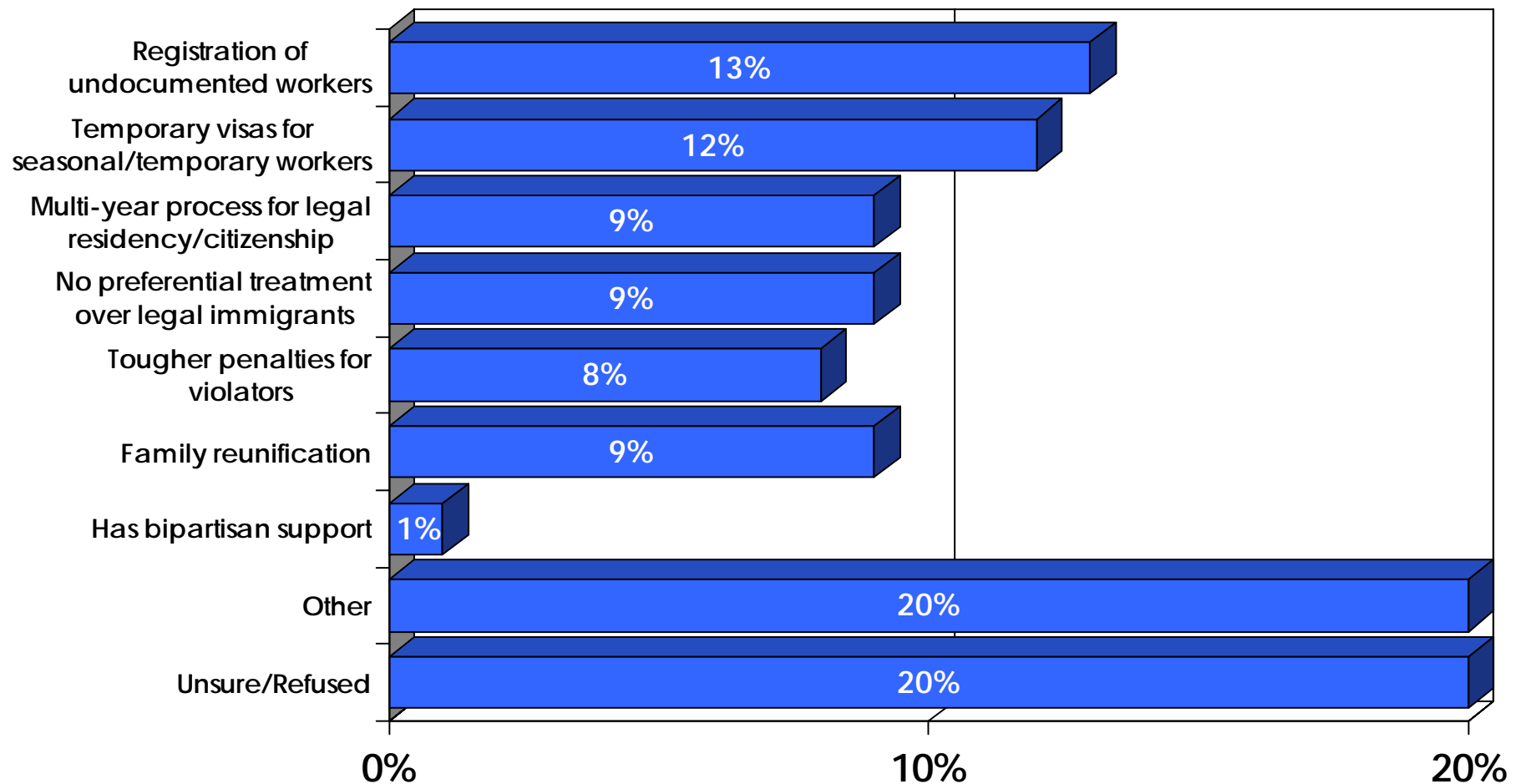

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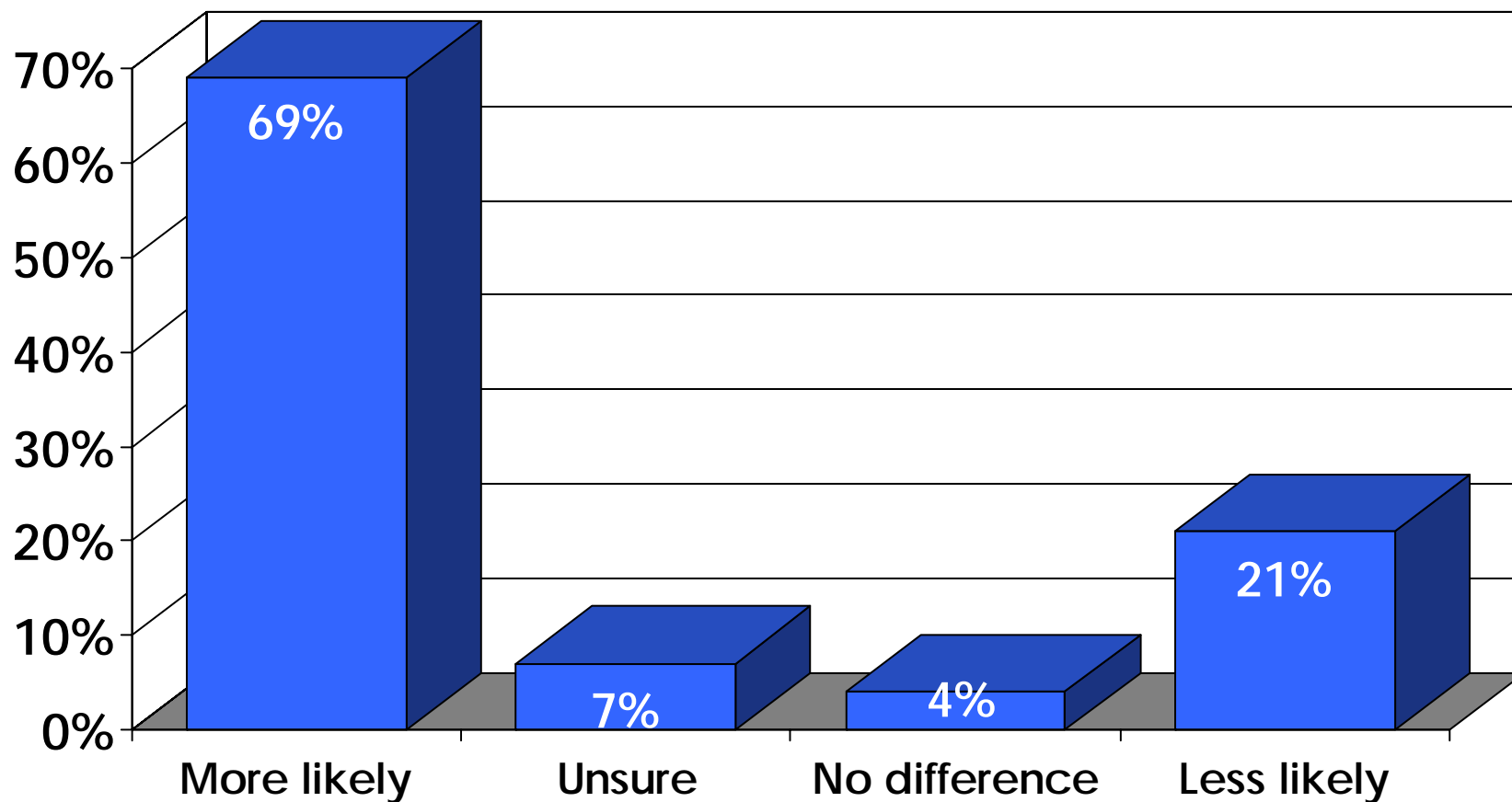
And, which of the items in this proposal was most important to you in your decision to oppose this proposal?

(Asked of N= 173, or 22% of total sample)



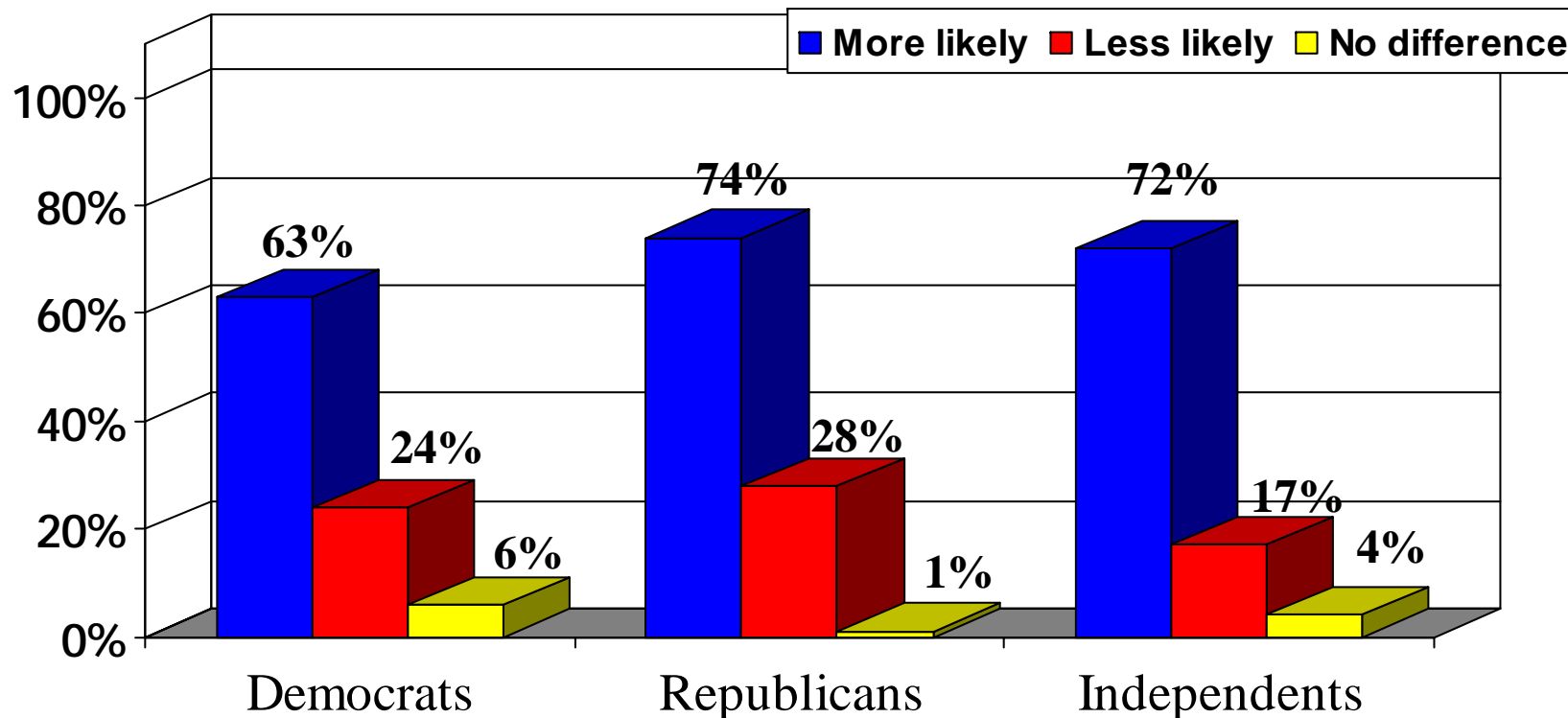
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If a candidate for Congress supported this type of immigration reform proposal, would you be more likely or less likely to vote for this candidate?



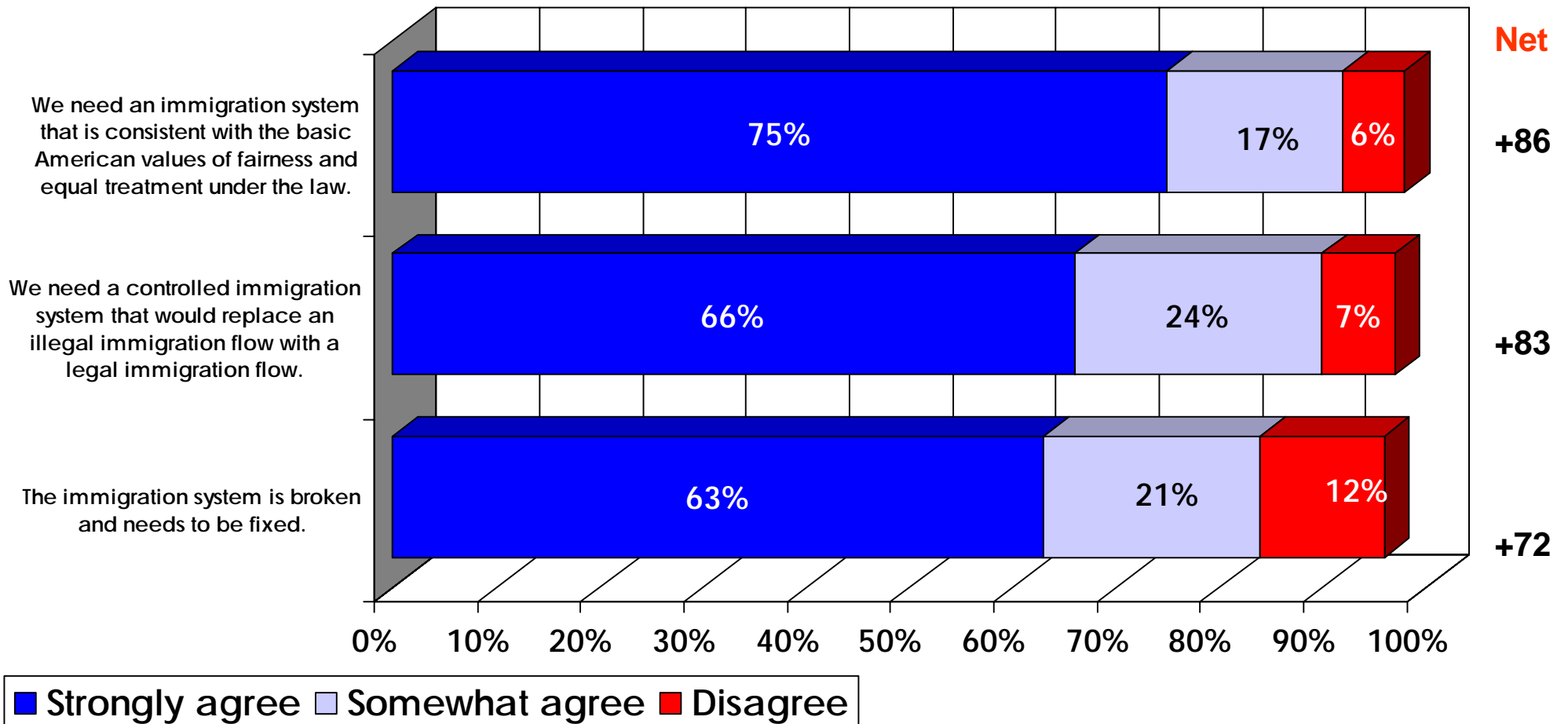
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Supporting this proposal helps candidates across party lines.



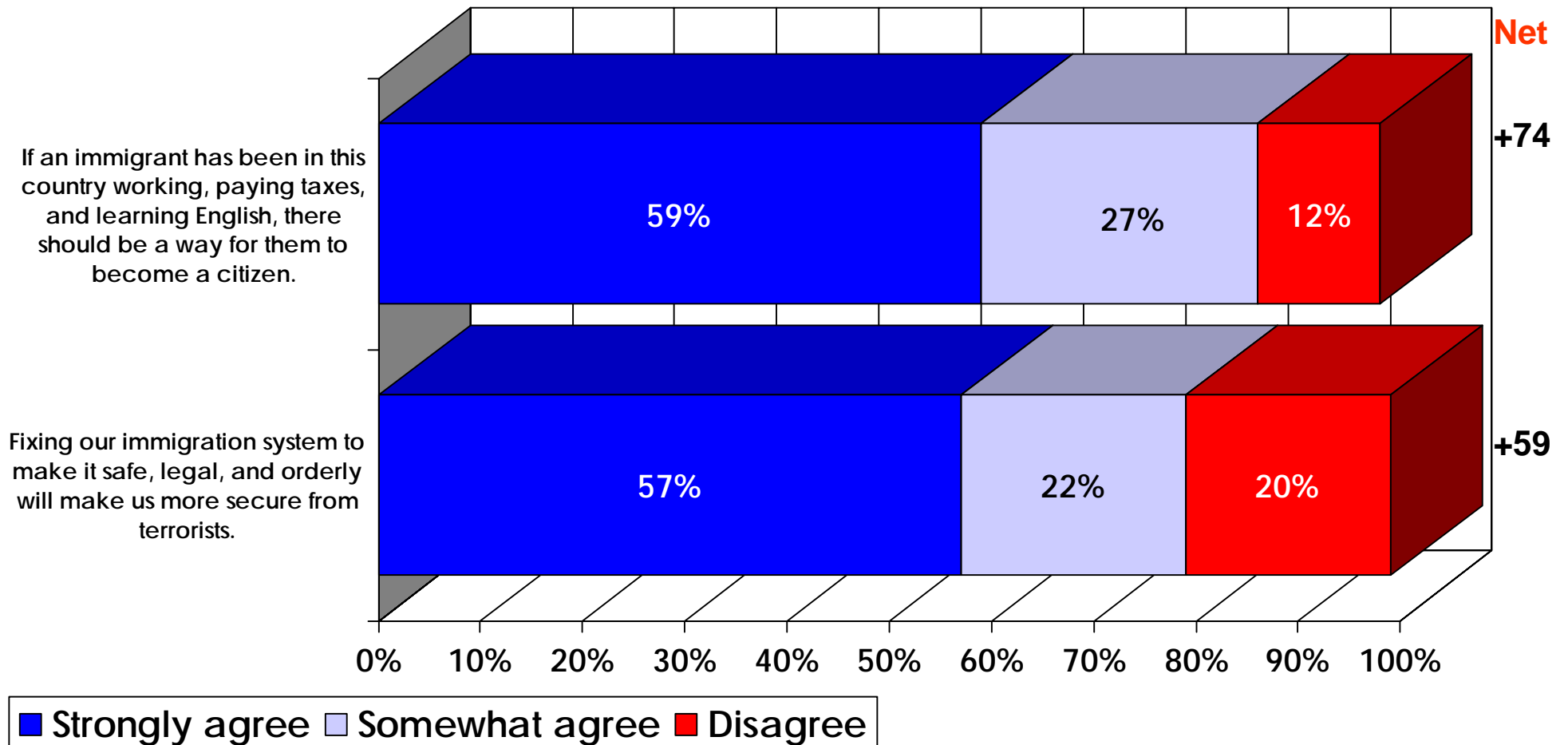

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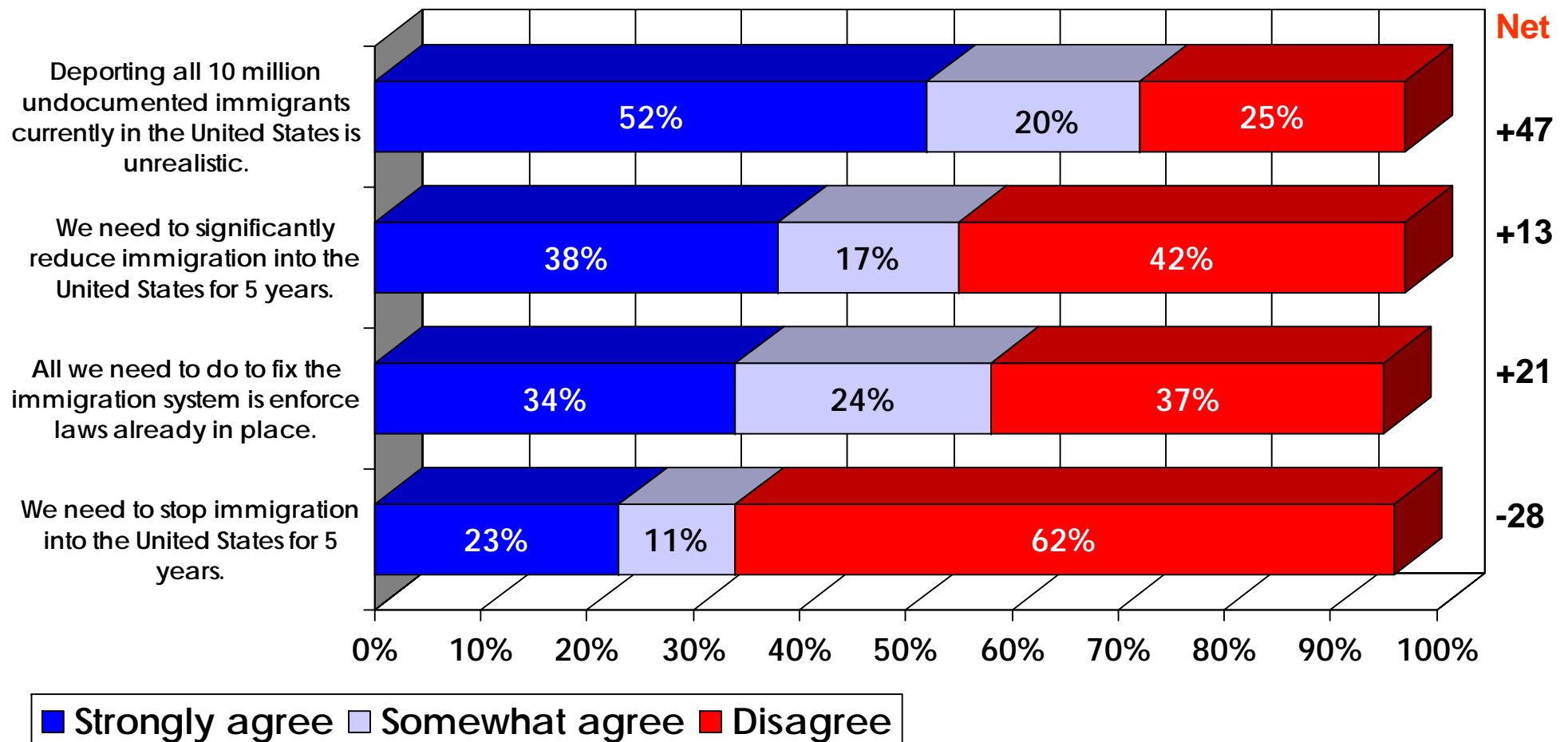
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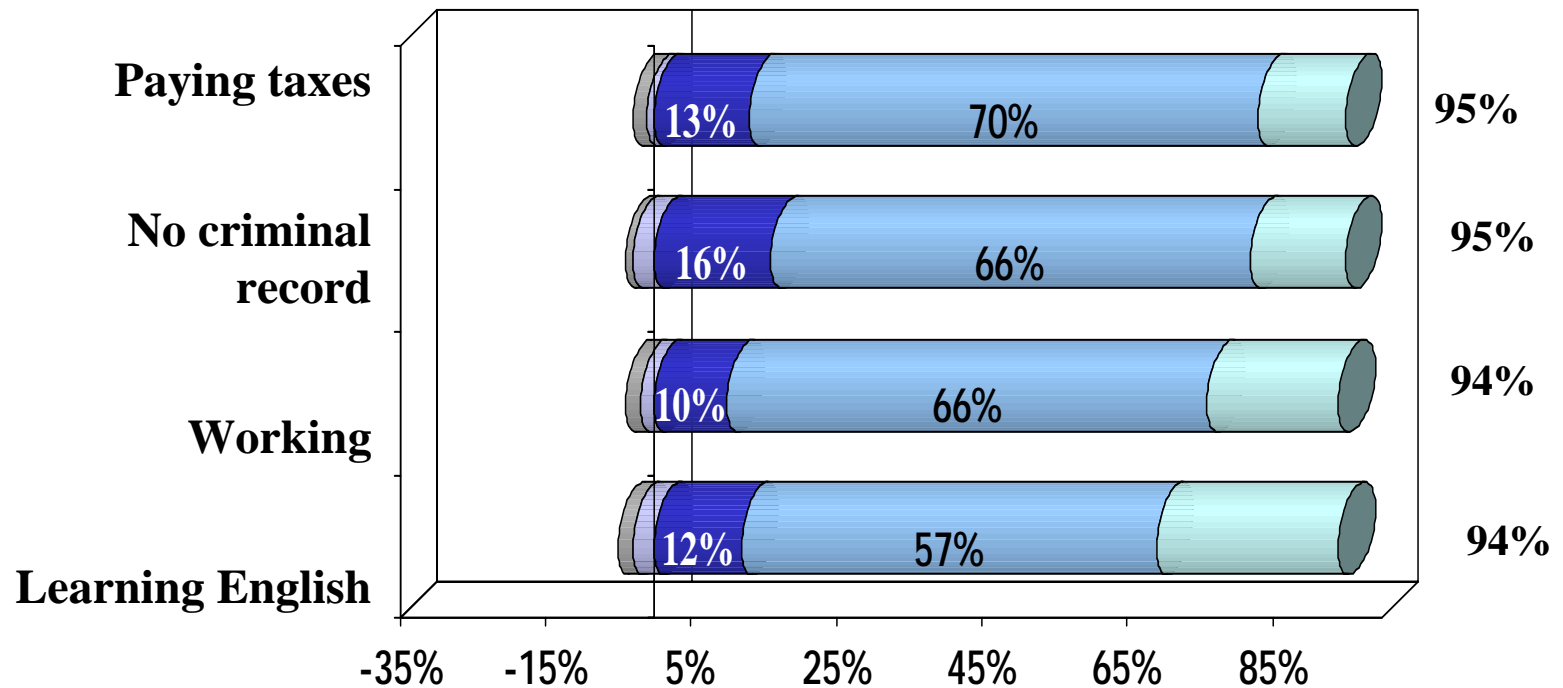

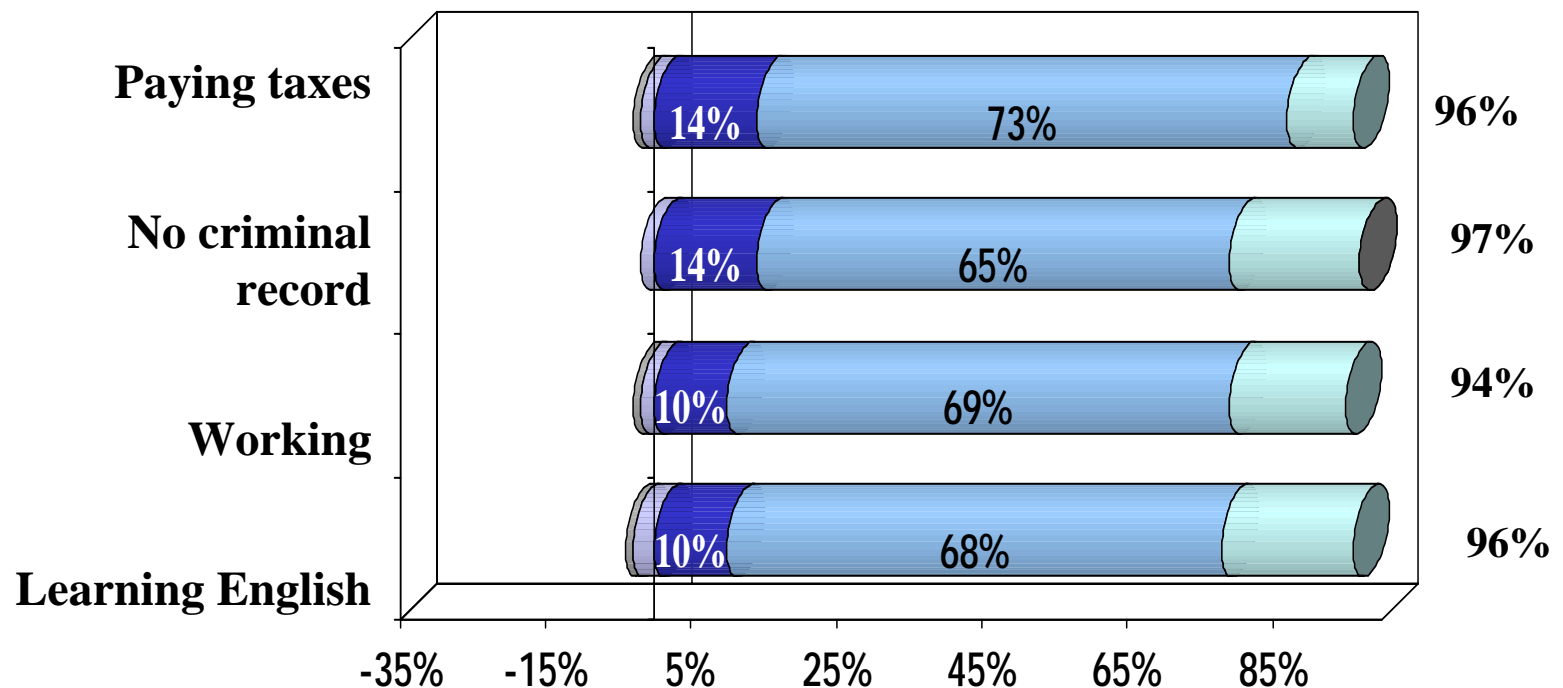


Darker shades = greater intensity

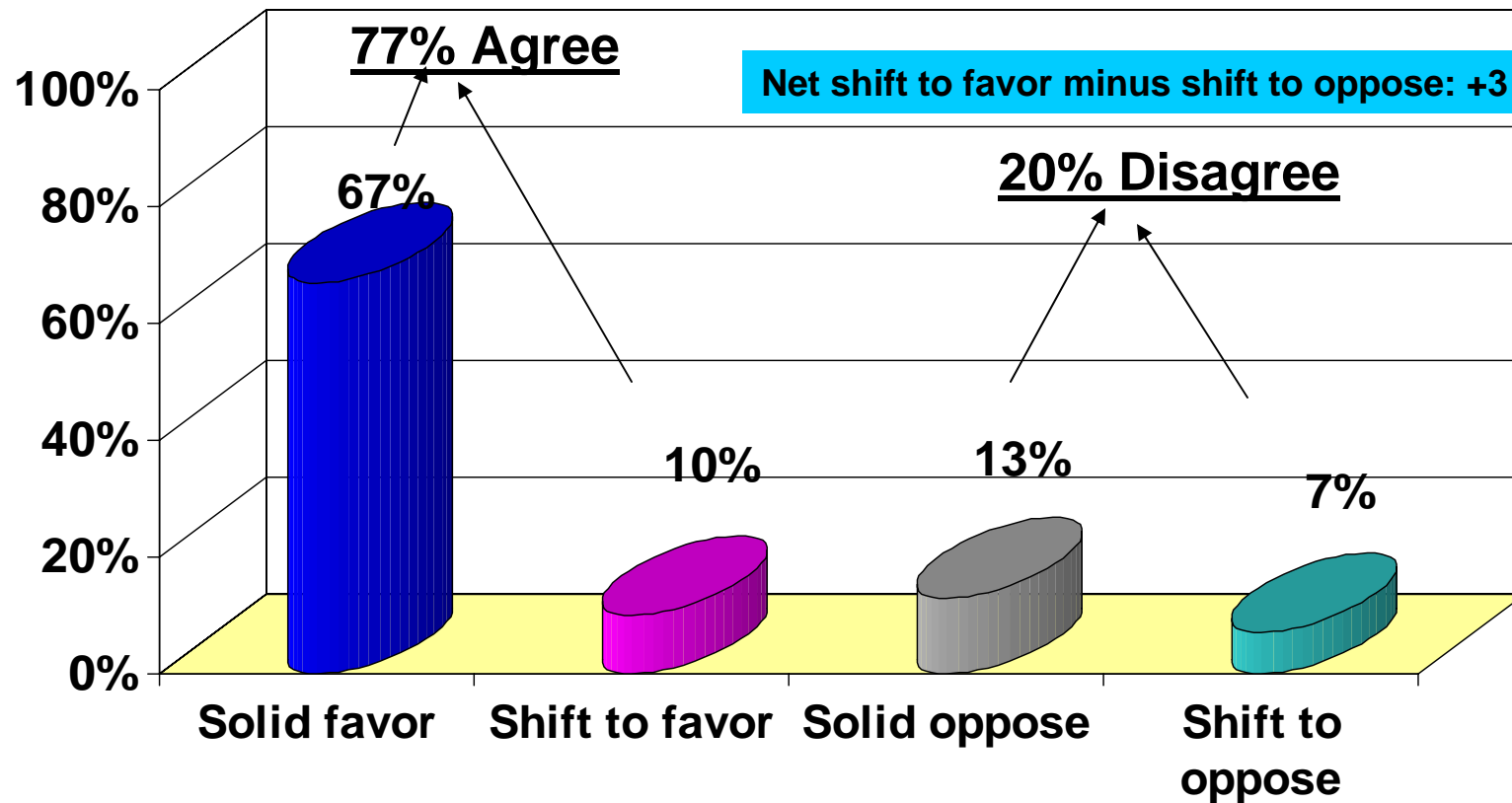
(Split Sample B)



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After voters hear positive and negative messages, the proposal picks up support.



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After messages, support for the proposal remains strong across party lines, gaining support among Democrats and Republicans.
