12/18/14	Brazil	Updated I visa validity and fee.
12/17/14	Albania	Validities for various visa classes and added the C1//D and NATO categories.
12/8/14	Israel, West Bank Gaza Strip	Updated info regarding travel documents issued by the Palestinian Authority.
12/1/14	Curacao	Updated declaration of good conduct language to reflect that it is issued by the Ministry of Justice.
