Each designated Regional Center entity must file a Form I-924A for each fiscal year (October 1 through September 30) within 90 days after the end of the fiscal year (on or before December 29) of the calendar year in which the fiscal year ended.</p> <p>Failure to timely file a Form I-924 Supplement for each fiscal year in which the regional center has been designated for participation in the Immigrant Investor Pilot Program will result in the issuance of an intent to terminate the participation of the regional center in the Pilot Program, which may ultimately result in the termination of the approval and designation of the regional center.</p> | <p>[Page 1]</p> <p>What Is the Purpose of This Supplement?</p> <p>This supplement is used to demonstrate a regional center's continued eligibility for the regional center designation. Each approved regional center must file Form I-924A, Supplement to Form I-924, for each fiscal year (October 1 through September 30) on or before December 29 of the calendar year in which the fiscal year ended. An approved regional center with a designation letter dated on or before September 30 of a particular calendar year must file its initial Form I-924A on or before December 29 of the same calendar year. An approved regional center with a designation letter dated on or after October 1 of a particular calendar year must file its initial Form I-924A on or before December 29 of the following calendar year.</p> <p>Failure to file Form I-924A in a timely manner for each fiscal year in which the regional center has been designated to participate in the Immigrant Investor Program will result in a notice of intent to terminate the participation. Such failure may ultimately result in the termination of the approval and designation of the regional center.</p> |
