Becoming a citizen through naturalization: The application process



Check Your Eligibility

You already checked your eligibility! You may be eligible for citizenship on the following basis: *(You have been a lawful permanent resident for more than 5 years.)*



Application for Naturalization (N-400)

The next step is to complete the application itself. Here, we will ask about your history, family, and character in order to find out whether you are eligible to become a citizen. Here is what you should know about the form:

If you are under the age of 75, the filing fee is \$725. This includes the \$640 standard fee and an \$85 biometric fee. If you are over the age of 75, there is no biometric fee, so the cost is \$640



Filing Online

Submitting this form online is the same as mailing in a completed paper form, and they both gather the same information (and cost the same).



Security

If you leave your application inactive for more than 30 days, we will delete your data in order to prevent storing personal information indefinitely.

What happens after I apply?



Biometrics appointment

A few weeks after you submit your application, we will contact you to schedule an appointment at an Application Support Center near you. At the appointment, we will get your fingerprints, photograph, and signature.



Requests for evidence

If we need more information, we will contact you to ask for other documents. This can happen before or after your interview.



Interview

After your biometric appointment, we will schedule your interview at a local USCIS office. At the interview, you will answer questions about your application, then take the civics and English tests.



Oath of Allegiance

If your application is approved, you are ready to take the oath of allegiance! At your naturalization ceremony, you will return your Permanent Resident Card, answer questions about your activity since the interview, take the Oath of Allegiance, and get your Certificate of Naturalization.
