19	submitted under subsection (a) shall include—
20	((1) an analysis of other methods of employ-
21	ment suitability tests that detect deception and could
22	be used in conjunction with traditional background
23	investigations to evaluate potential employees for
24	suitability; and

"(2) a recommendation regarding whether a
 test referred to in paragraph (1) should be adopted
 by U.S. Customs and Border Protection when the
 polygraph examination requirement is waived pursuant to section 3(b).".
