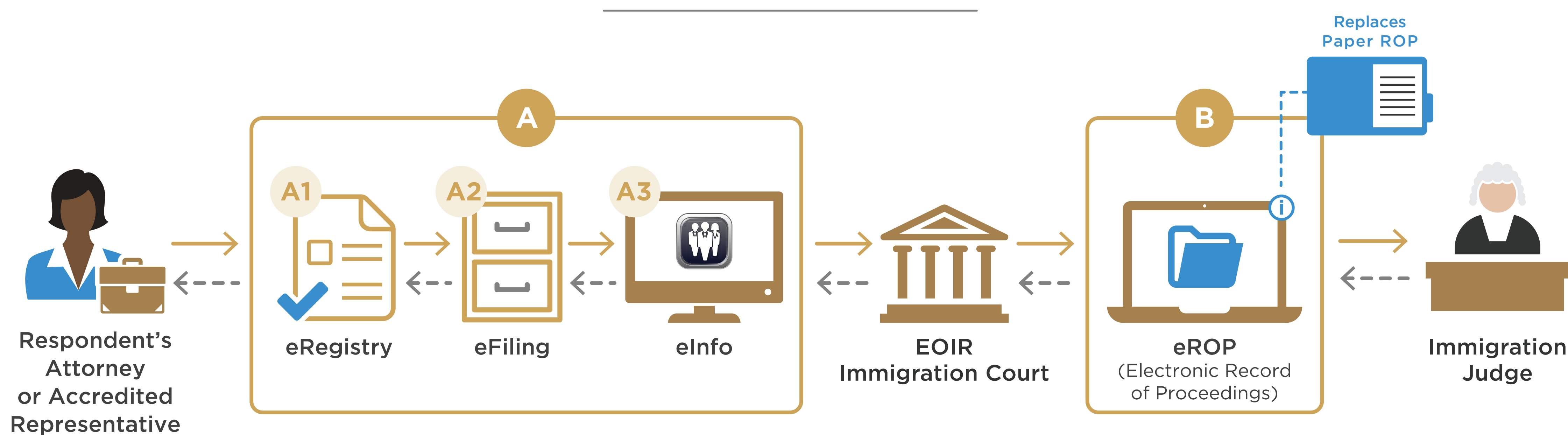


A SNAPSHOT: HOW ECAS SYSTEMS WORK TOGETHER

Respondent Attorneys and Accredited Representatives



A Access eRegistry, eInfo, and eFiling

- A1 eRegistry**
One-time registration in eRegistry is required to be able to access eInfo.
- A2 eFiling**
Attorneys or accredited representatives apply through eFiling to represent a specific respondent (forms EOIR 27, 28).

- A3 eInfo**
Respondent's attorney or representative can use eInfo to:
- View case details
 - Electronically file case related documents such as EOIR 33 change of address, evidence, motions
 - View and print electronic case records (eROP records)
 - Find out whether documents have been accepted or rejected by EOIR, with rejection explanation

B eROP (Electronic Record of Proceedings)

Electronic repository of official case records.

Note: Existing-paper-based ROPs will remain in hardcopy files.
