CBP Announces Opening of Temporary Processing Facility in Tucson, Arizona

TUCSON, Arizona — U.S. Customs and Border Protection today announced the opening of a soft-sided facility in Tucson, Arizona. The facility's primary purpose is to safely and expeditiously process individuals in U.S. Border Patrol custody.

The facility will be weatherproof, climate-controlled, and is expected to provide ample areas for eating, sleeping, and personal hygiene. The new facility's design is similar to that of recently constructed soft-sided facilities. The over 80,000 square foot facility sits on six acres at **4550 East Los Reales Road in Tucson, Arizona. (x-apple-data-detectors://2)** The temporary facility will provide additional processing capacity for Border Patrol's Tucson Sector.

Since April 2020, CBP has seen a steady increase in border encounters from the Western Hemisphere due in part to worsening economic conditions brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic and natural disasters affecting the area.
