Presidential Proclamation, "A Proclamation on Revoking Proclamation 10315"

- On November 26, 2021, the President of the United States signed a Presidential Proclamation entitled: "A *Proclamation on Suspension of Entry as Immigrants and Nonimmigrants of Certain Additional Persons Who Pose a Risk of Transmitting Coronavirus Disease 2019*" due to the emerging COVID-19 Omicron variant.
- Effective at 12:01 a.m. Eastern Standard Time (EST) on December 31, 2021, in accordance with this Proclamation, Presidential Proclamation 10315 restricting travel for individuals who had been physically present within South Africa, Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, and Zimbabwe, is revoked.
- This Proclamation supplements, and does not supersede, other recent public health travel requirements, including the recently issued Presidential Proclamation and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) order requiring travelers arriving in the air environment to test negative for COVID-19 and/or be fully vaccinated prior to boarding a flight to the United States.
