ABA Free Legal Answers is a website where you can submit your questions about civil (non-criminal) legal issues and receive answers from pro bono lawyers. The federal **ABA Free Legal Answers** site allows individuals to submit their **immigration questions**, including questions about green cards, visas, court proceedings, asylum, DACA, TPS and other issues, as well as **veterans federal issues**, including VA benefits, discharge upgrades, and similar veterans legal issues.

It's **EASY**. Legal questions are submitted online. All you need is an internet connection.

It's **CONVENIENT**. Volunteer attorneys can answer your questions outside of regular business hours – no need to attend a clinic or visit a legal aid office.



HOW MUCH DO I HAVE TO PAY?

Nothing! ABA Free Legal Answers is a no cost service for low income individuals who meet minimum income requirements.

WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE INTERNET ACCESS?

If you do not have internet access, you can go to a public library and use it for free.

IS MY QUESTION CONFIDENTIAL?

Yes. All questions asked on ABA Free Legal Answers are kept private by the attorney and the site administrators.

WHAT QUESTIONS MAY I ASK?

For immigration-related questions, you can ask about work permits, visas, green cards, asylum, court appointments, or anything else related to immigration. For veterans federal issues, you may ask about VA benefits, discharge upgrades, and similar veterans legal issues. WHAT IF MY ATTORNEY IS UNABLE TO ANSWER MY QUESTION ONLINE?

If your question cannot be answered online, we will provide you with a list of other places to find help to answer your question.

HOW OFTEN CAN I USE THIS SERVICE?

Individuals using ABA Free Legal Answers are limited to asking five separate questions per year.

CAN I ASK A CRIMINAL LAW QUESTION?

No. But you can ask if a criminal arrest or charge will impact your immigration case.
