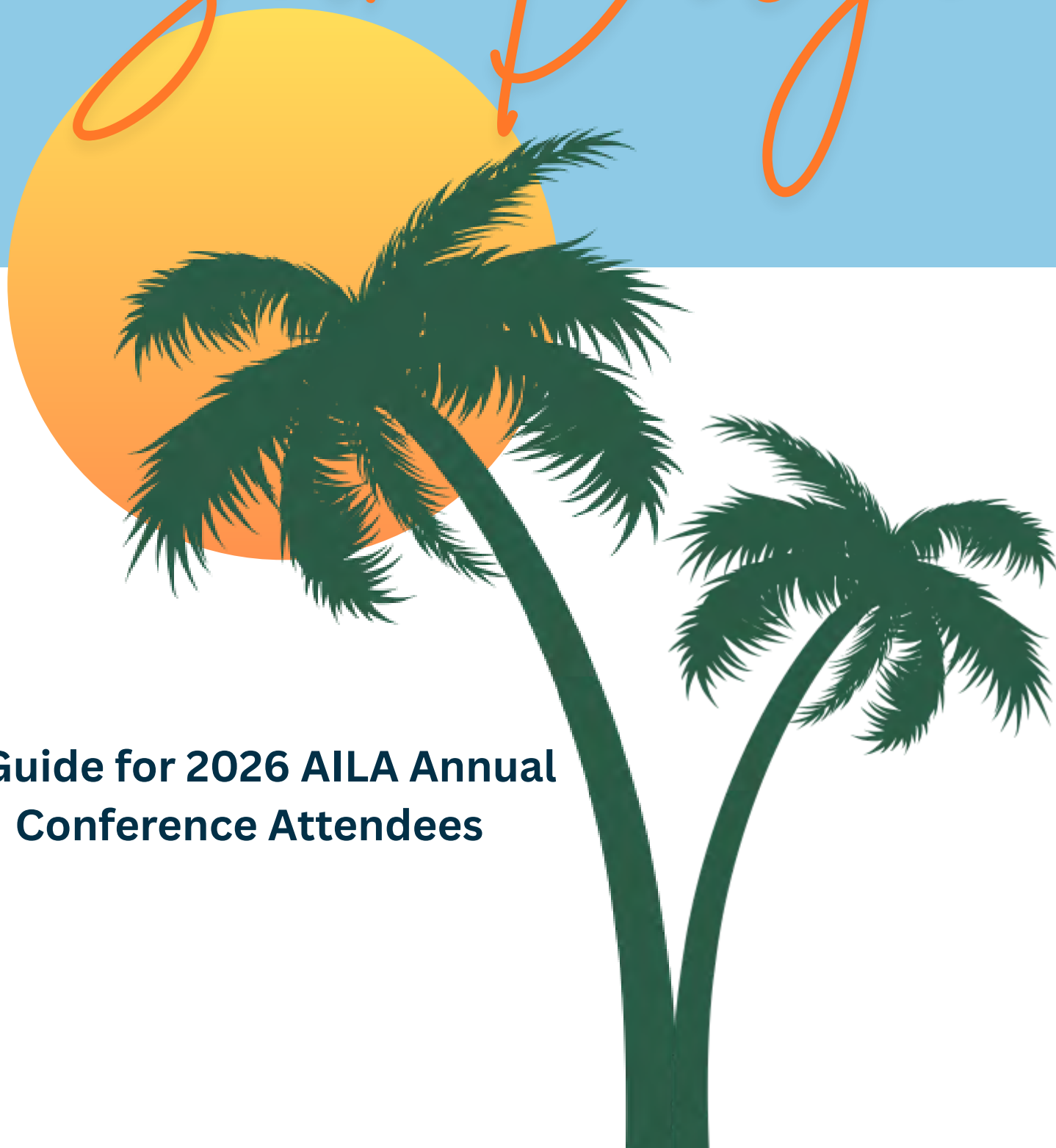

VISITING SAN DIEGO IN JUNE



June is a beautiful time to visit San Diego. Unlike many parts of the country that are already in full summer heat, coastal San Diego often experiences “June Gloom.” A cool marine layer forms overnight and can linger into the morning hours.

What to pack:

- A light jacket or sweater for mornings and evenings
- Sunglasses and sunscreen
- A swimsuit for the beach or pool

What to expect:

- Gray or overcast skies in the morning
- Clearing between late morning and early afternoon
- Sunny, mild afternoons
- Cooler evenings near the coast

The conference is located in the Seaport Village area of downtown San Diego. The surrounding waterfront and many downtown attractions are easily walkable, or you can take the [San Diego Trolley](#) to explore other parts of the city. Popular uptown neighborhoods and nearby beaches are just a short drive away.

The San Diego Trolley has several lines serving downtown:

- **Blue Line** – Connects downtown with San Ysidro and La Jolla / UC San Diego.
- **Orange Line** – Runs from downtown east to El Cajon.
- **Green Line** – Connects downtown to Mission Valley and Santee.
- **Silver Line** – A historic streetcar loop around downtown areas like the Gaslamp Quarter.

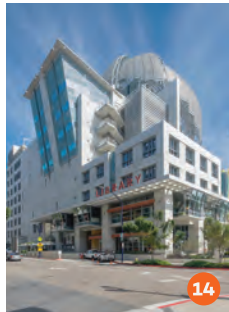

Waterfront Park

Tuna Harbor Park

Originally named for its connection to the fishing industry as a tuna port, this park includes shaded areas to relax, a scenic promenade, bike routes and a perfect vantage point for watching boats in San Diego Bay.



Rady Shell at Jacobs Park

An architectural wonder, the Rady Shell is equal parts state-of-the-art concert venue and public open space for all to enjoy. Experience musical concerts, symphony performances, private events, and a public promenade.



Tweet Street Park

Located in Cortez, Tweet Street Park is a sweet retreat in this residential neighborhood. Its name was inspired by birdhouses created as part of a public art competition to attract native birds back to the neighborhood.



MLK, Jr. Promenade

Martin Luther King, Jr. Promenade is a twelve-acre park designed for people of all ages to enjoy. The 0.6-mile-long linear park begins in the Gaslamp Quarter and features public art and plaques highlighting some of Dr. King's powerful words.



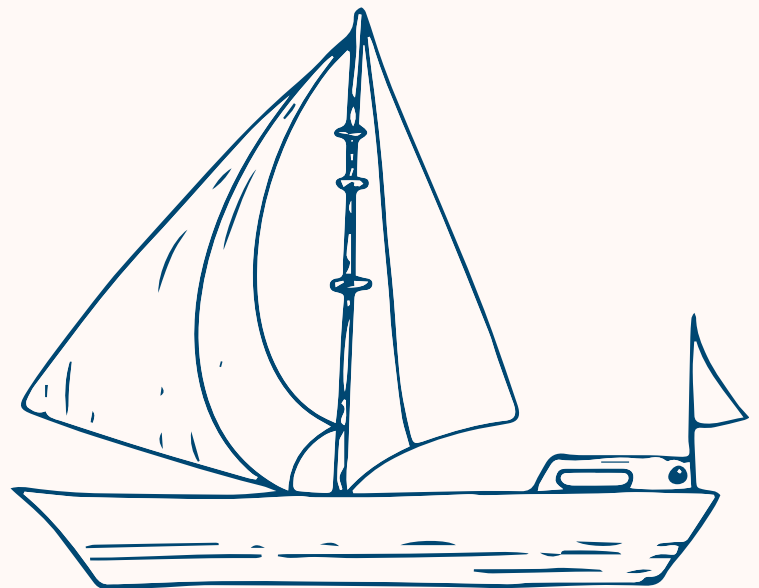

Coronado is a charming coastal resort city known for wide sandy beaches, historic architecture, and a relaxed seaside vibe. Located across San Diego Bay, it blends small-town charm with upscale resort living and is easy to explore on foot or by bike.

Ways to Explore



Unwind at Coronado Beach

One of the top beaches in the U.S., Coronado Beach features sparkling sand, gentle waves, and beautiful sunsets—perfect for a stroll or a quick seaside break.

Visit the Historic Hotel del Coronado

Opened in 1888, the iconic “Del” is a National Historic Landmark known for its Victorian architecture, oceanfront dining, and boutique shops.

Bike the Silver Strand

Ride along this scenic coastal stretch between Coronado and Imperial Beach with ocean breezes and views of both the Pacific and San Diego Bay.

Stroll Orange Avenue

Coronado’s main street is lined with cafés, boutiques, galleries, and casual dining—perfect for coffee, lunch, or souvenir shopping.

Ride the Ferry



Ferry service runs between the Coronado Ferry Landing and Broadway Pier in downtown San Diego, with another route from the San Diego Convention Center. Ferries depart hourly, taking about 15 minutes. Advance purchase online or at the ticket booth is recommended. Free for children under 4.

Relax at NTC Park – Enjoy walking paths, open green spaces, and waterfront views along San Diego Bay.

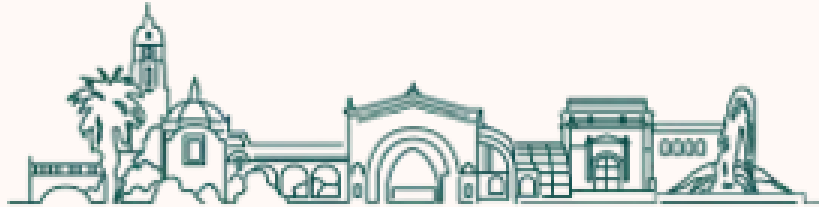
Liberty Station is a vibrant waterfront district built on the former Naval Training Center campus. Today, the historic Spanish-Colonial buildings house restaurants, art studios, shops, parks, and entertainment venues —making it a popular spot for dining, strolling, and enjoying the bay.

See a show at Joan & Irwin Jacobs Performing Arts Theater – Home to live theater productions and performances by Cygnet Theatre.

Play mini golf at The Loma Club – A fun 9-hole putting course perfect for a quick, casual game with friends or colleagues.



BALBOA PARK



Located just minutes from downtown San Diego, Balboa Park is a 1,200-acre cultural park filled with museums, gardens, historic Spanish-Colonial architecture, and performing arts venues. Originally developed for the Panama–California Exposition, the park is now one of Southern California’s premier cultural destinations and home to more than a dozen museums, lush botanical gardens, and the famous San Diego Zoo.



Old Town Trolley Tours in San Diego offers a convenient hop-on, hop-off, 1-hour-and-45-minute narrated tour with a dedicated stop at Balboa Park/San Diego Zoo

Ways to Explore

Wander through the Botanical Building - A historic conservatory filled with orchids, palms, and tropical plants.

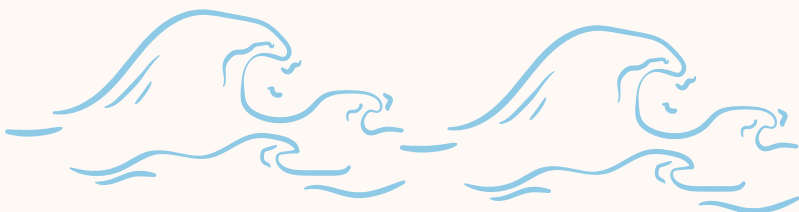

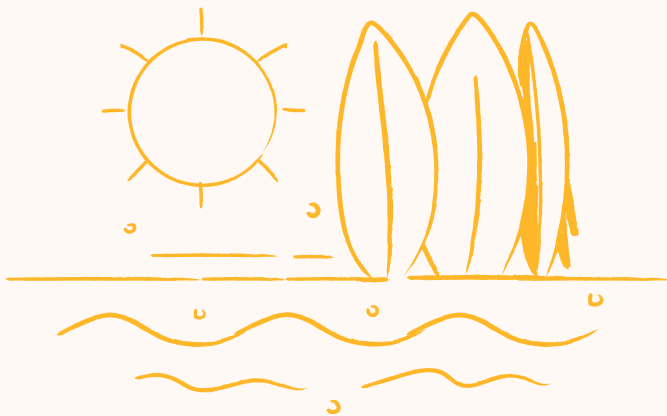


MISSION BEACH

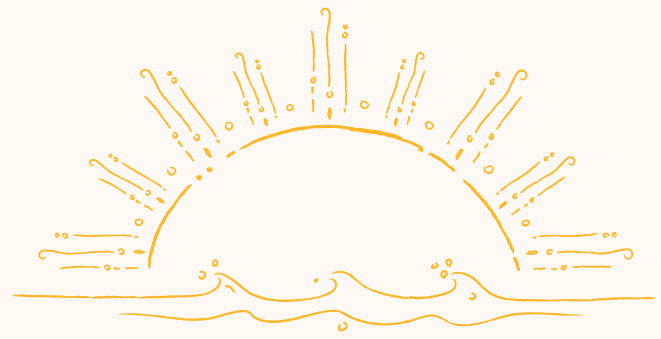

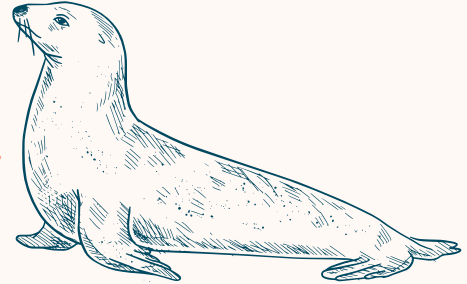

Visit La Jolla Cove. One of Southern California’s most photographed coastal spots, known for snorkeling and crystal-clear water.

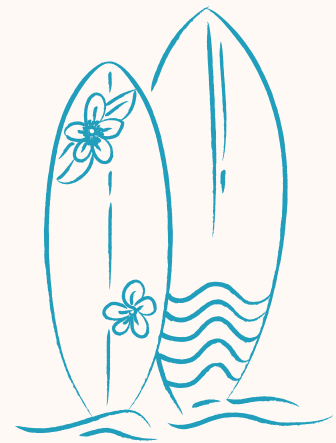

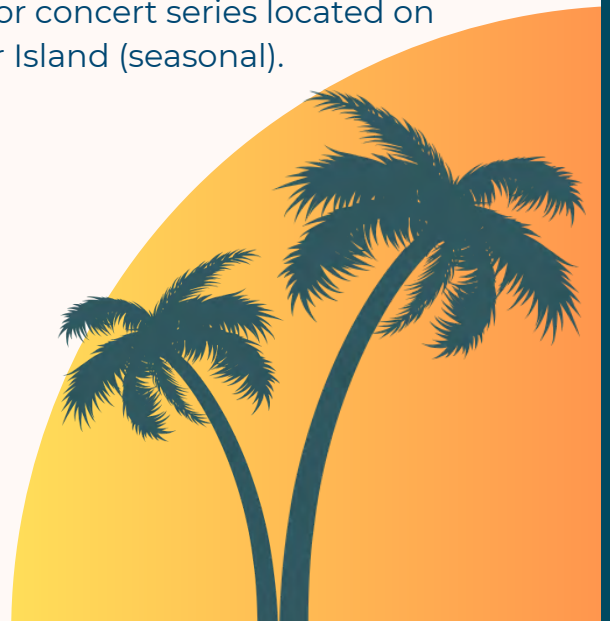

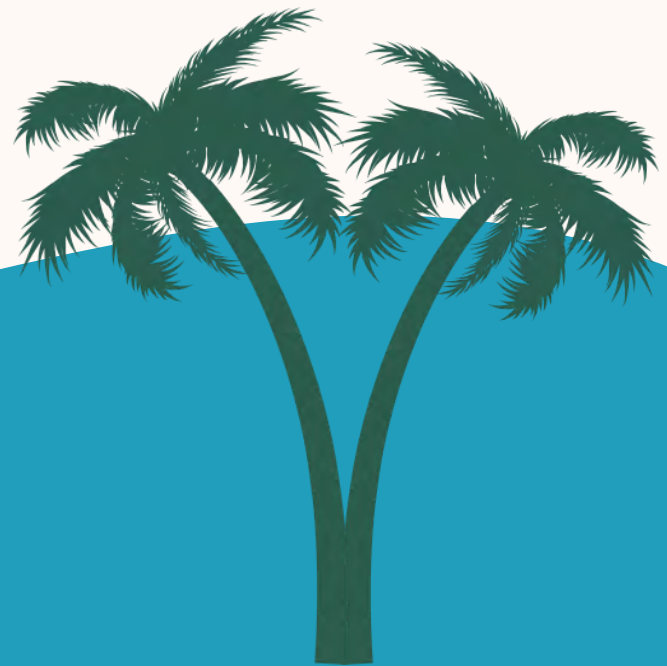
