ICE Appointment Scheduler update

WASHINGTON – U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) announced that noncitizens can now change their check-in appointments directly through the <u>ICE</u> <u>Appointment Scheduler</u>. Previously, noncitizens had to change their appointments via phone or in person.

The <u>ICE Appointment Scheduler</u> is a web-based, multilingual, and smartphone compatible appointment scheduler for noncitizens. The ICE Appointment Scheduler is available in English, Spanish, Portuguese, Haitian Creole and French.

The tool allows noncitizens to schedule their required check-in appointments at ICE Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO) offices as they await immigration proceedings.

Noncitizens can create their initial appointment online using information found on their I-385 form.
